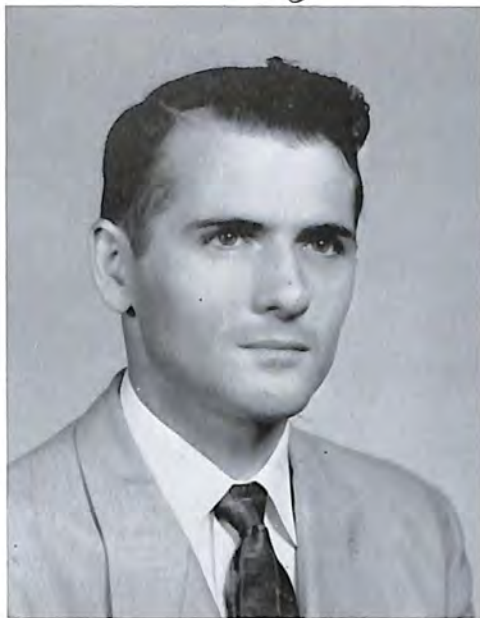
The Byars Hall Chorus, under the direction of Mr. Russell Phelps, has participated in three concerts the past school year.
