

We spent many week, with her guidance, photograhing our town, writing about our community and school, making scetches of our studies and even sending recordings of music to this two school. It was just one way that "Miss" Martha broadened out horizons.

"Miss" Martha was the Béta Club sponsor. She worked tirelessly in this area. Picnic, trips to conventions and meetings were a small part of her support. Even though Beta Club was an honor club she required citizenship be an important part of a student's character.

Her example touched many lives in a genuinely positive way. Her influence did not stop is 1965 at her death, but continues even today.
