In Hollywood we find Leroy Griffin manager for the great motion picture and TV starlet, Norma Woods, who is now playing in "Meet Me In San Quentin."

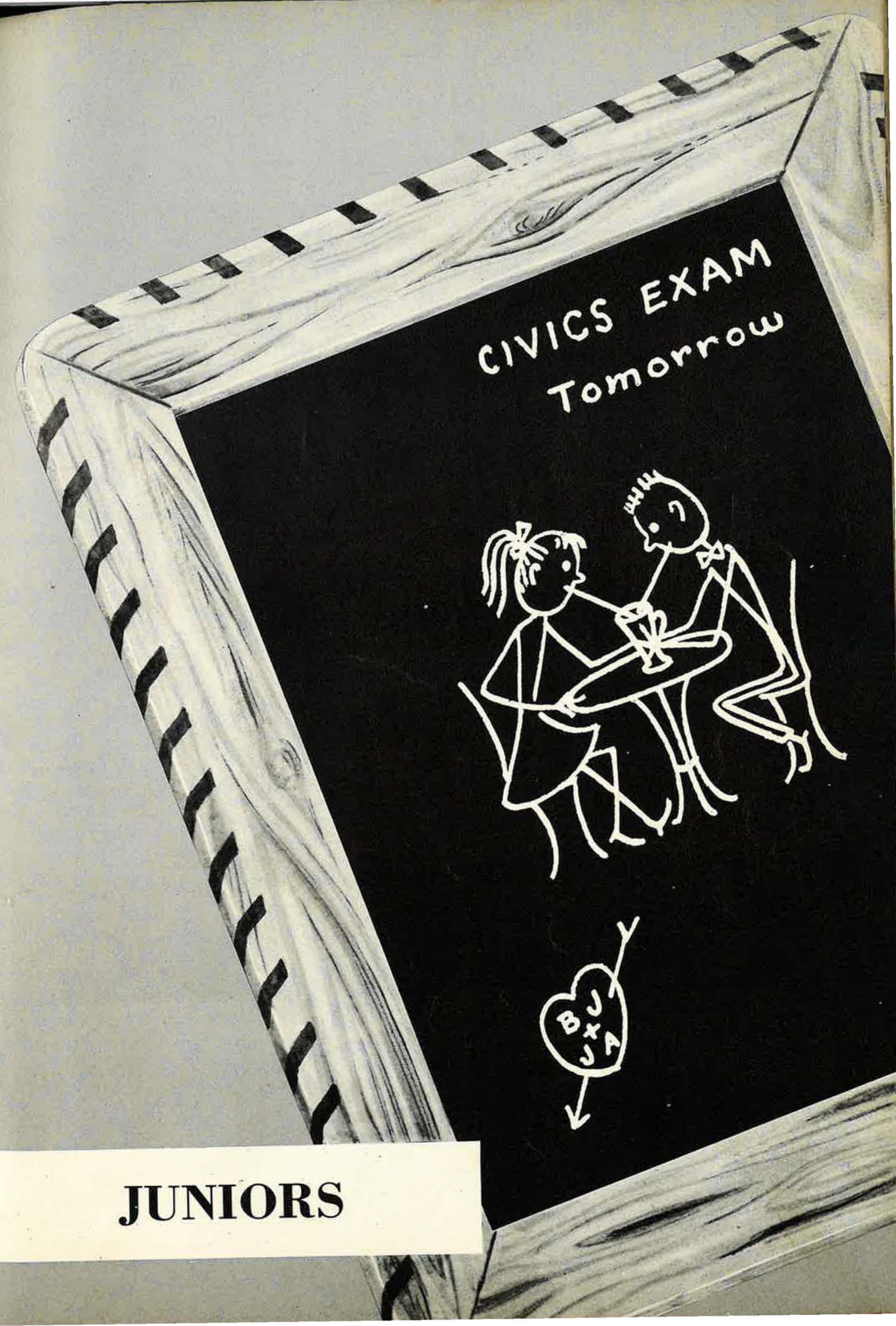

Members of the junior class of Brighton High School took members of the senior class on an Hawaiian Cruise Friday evening in the cafeteria of the Brighton High School.

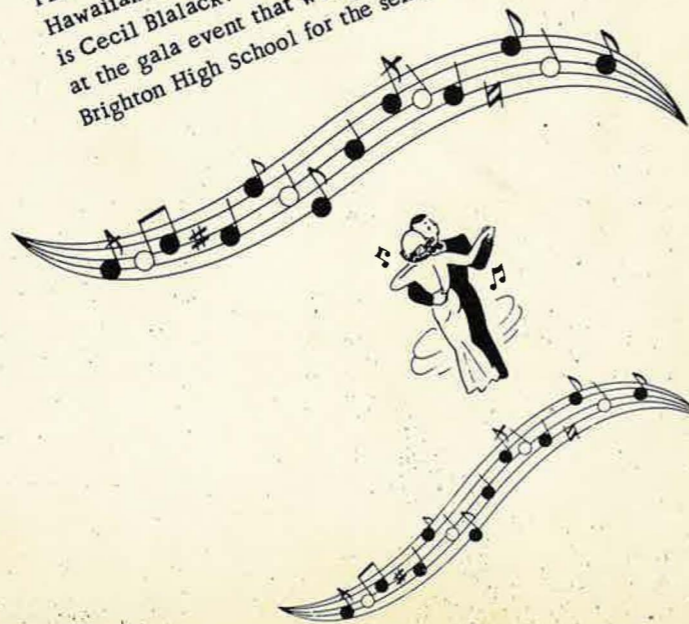

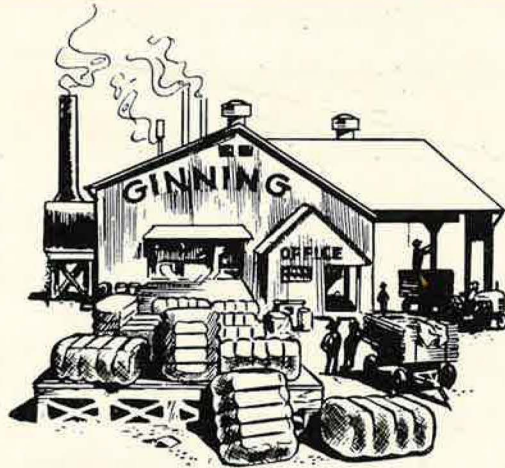

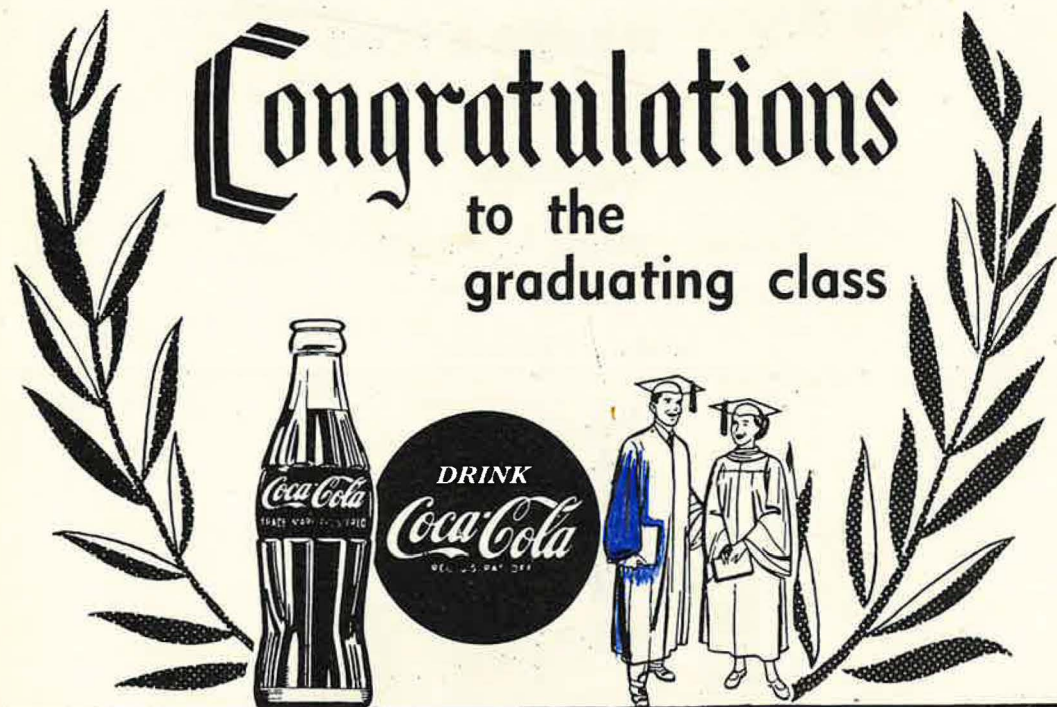
