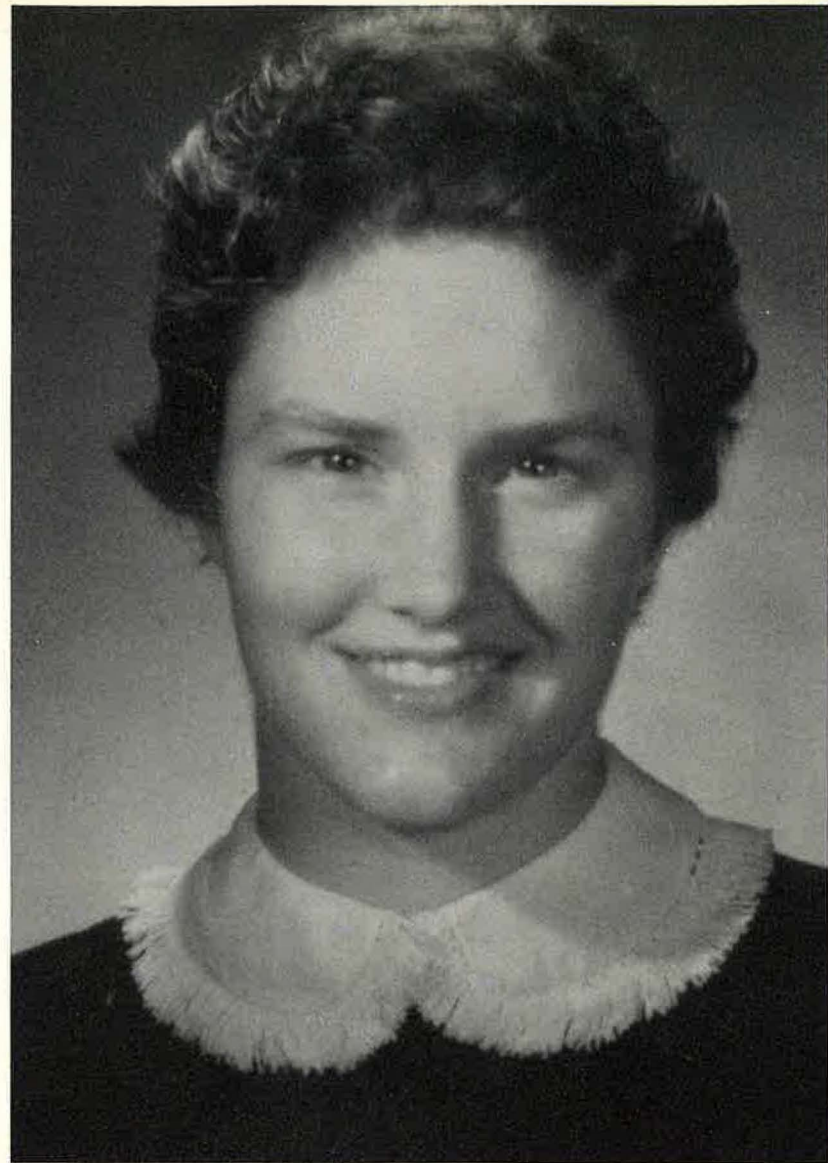

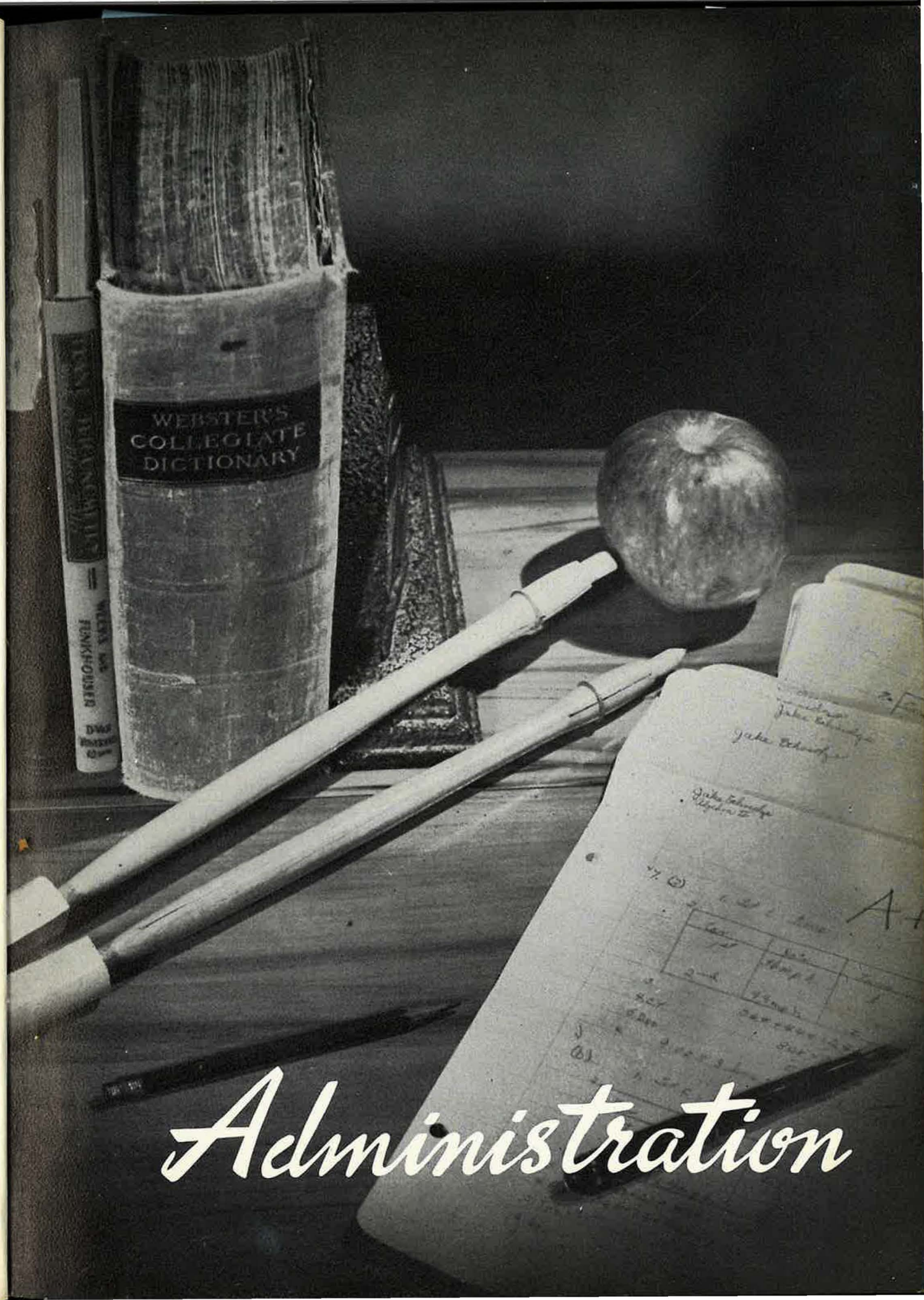

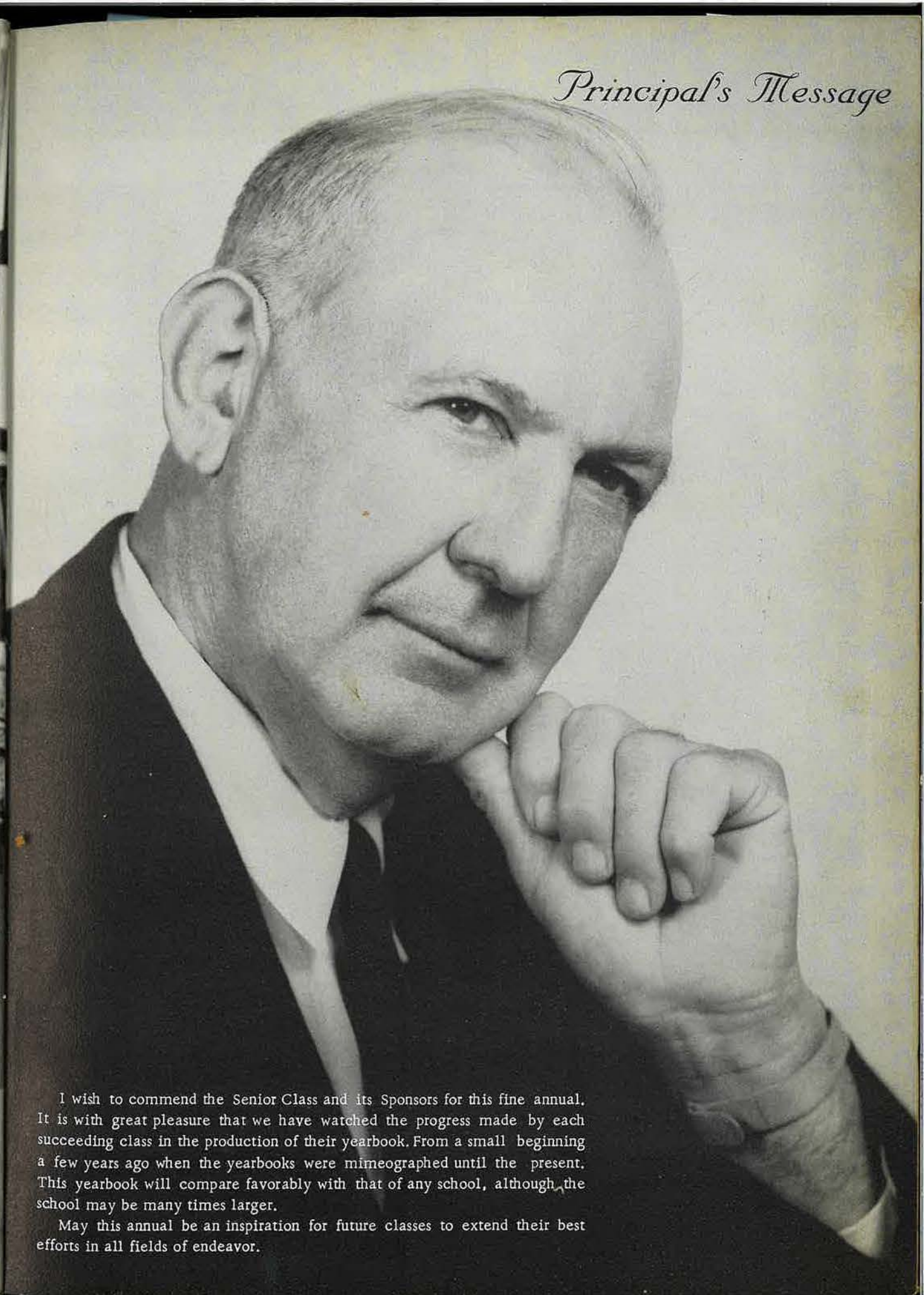
Superintendent's Message

Cards Open at Home In Easy Victories Over Maury City

Brighton's Cardinals opened their 1959-60 basketball season Friday night by scoring victories over Maury City, in both the boys and girls' games. The girls won by a score of 41-33 and the boys followed up with a 51-35 victory.

In the girls' game, the Maury City sextet took a narrow first quarter lead, 10-9, but the Brighton team came back strong in the second heat, with Jeanette Smith looping in 11 points, and Grace Smith six, while guards Ann Turnage, Florence Smith, and Brenda Delashmit were holding the Maury City forwards to a total of three points. Brighton had doubled the Maury City score, and led 26-13 at halftime.

The Maury City forwards had their big quarter in the third period, ranking up 15 points, while Brighton's Grace Smith dropped in three field goals for the Cardinals total of six. Maury City's comeback was shortlived, however, as they went into the final frame trailing 32-28. They were held to a total of five points in the last quarter while Brighton again widened their lead by netting nine points to finish eight points ahead.

Jeanette Smith tallied 22 points, and Grace Smith 19, to take the scoring honors.

The Brighton girls never had any trouble, in their game, as they outscored the Friendship sextet in every period. Jeanette Smith hit for nine points in the first quarter, to help give the Brighton team a 12-6 lead at the end of the first seven minutes.

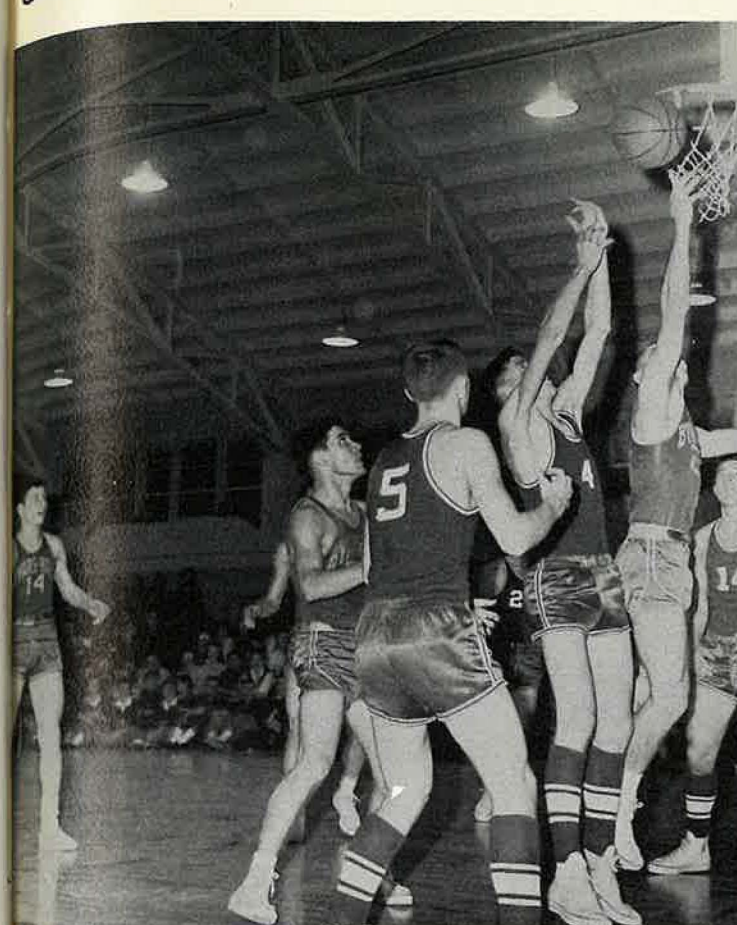

To the Juniors, we leave the title "Senior." We wish them luck in living up to its standards and responsibilities.

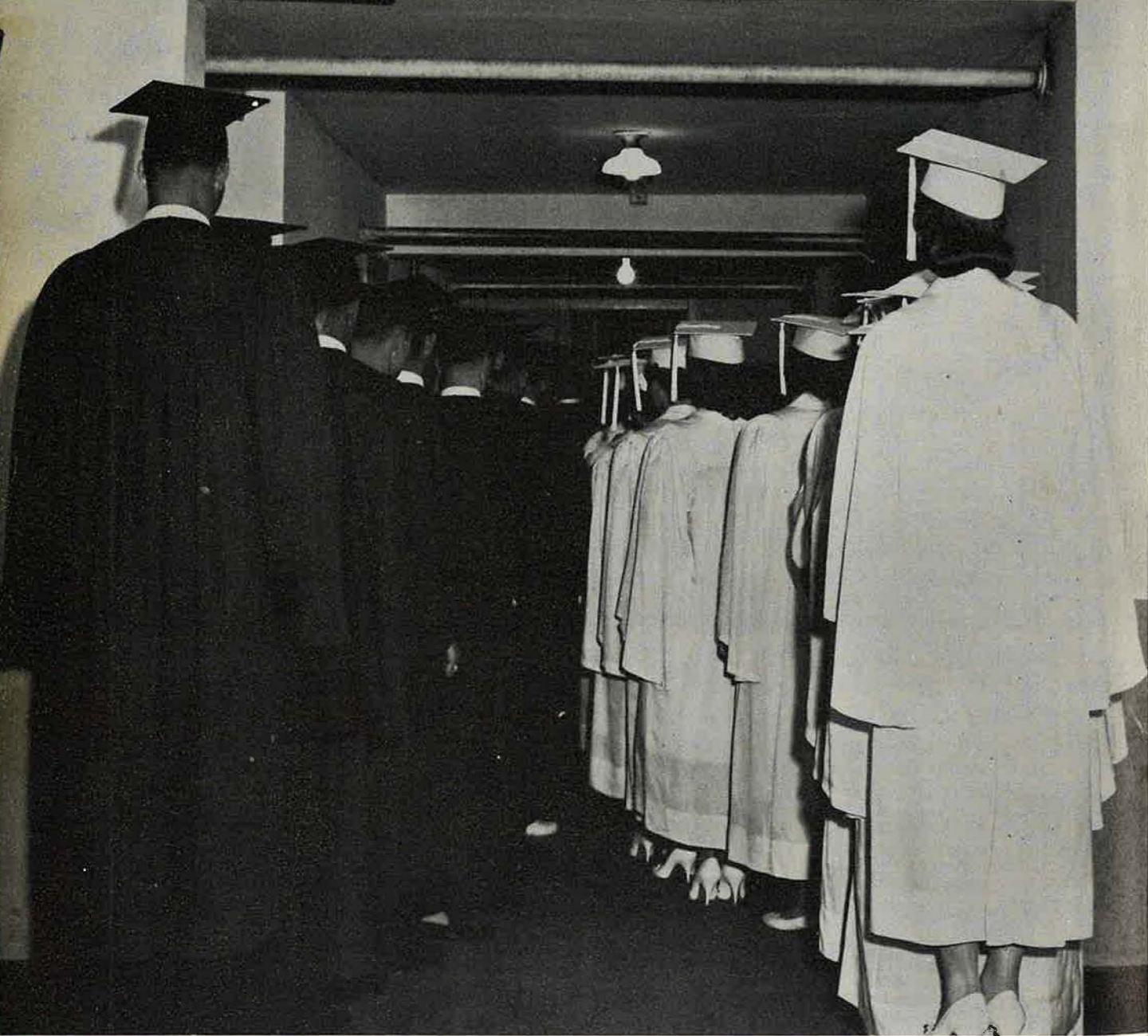
To the Sophomores, we leave our sympathy. Those typewriters aren't what they used to be.
