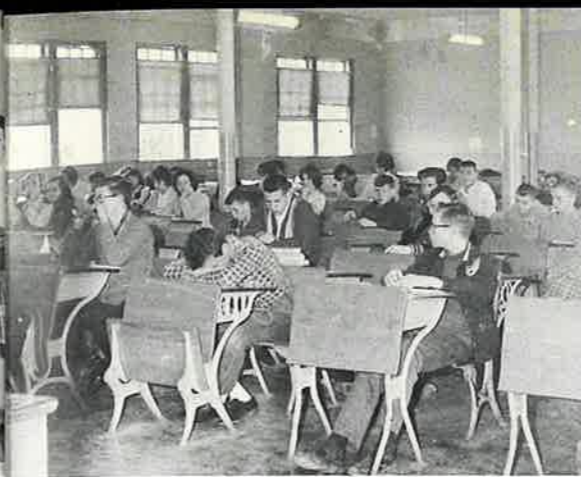

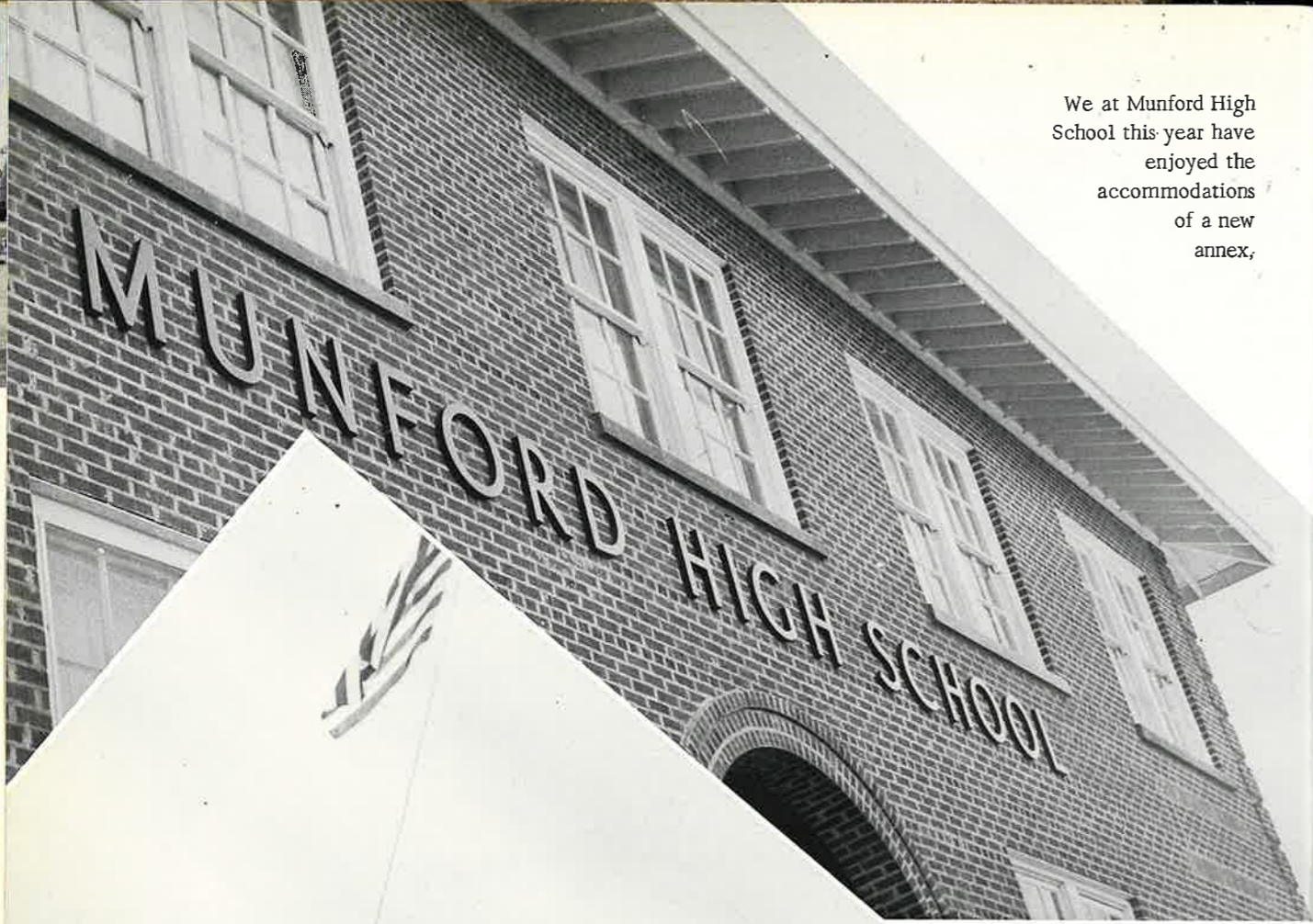

MOVEMENT — We move, we think, we talk, we act.

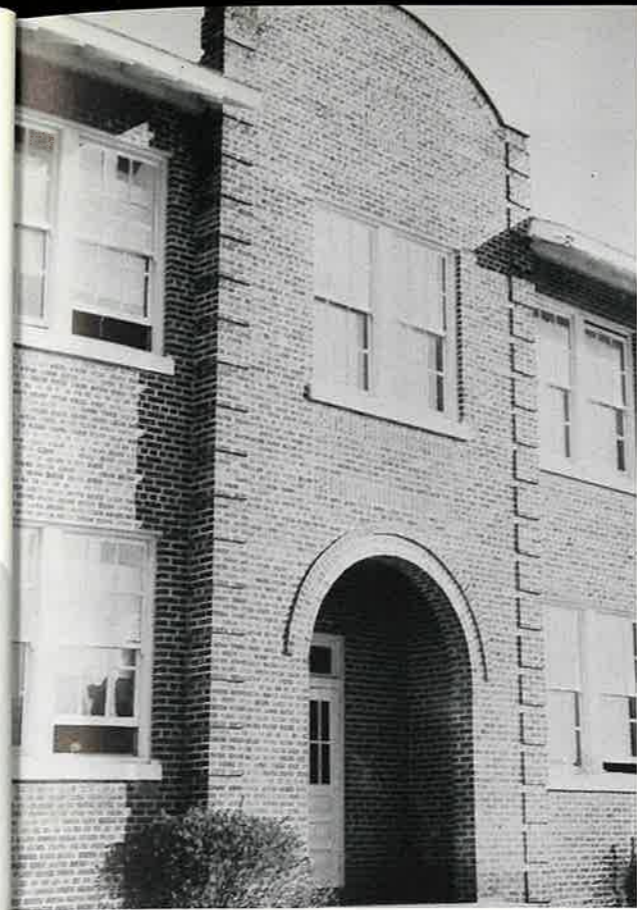
Rush to classes. Run to catch the bus. Ever hurrying to grasp the knowledge waiting for us, constantly alert to new and exciting ideas.

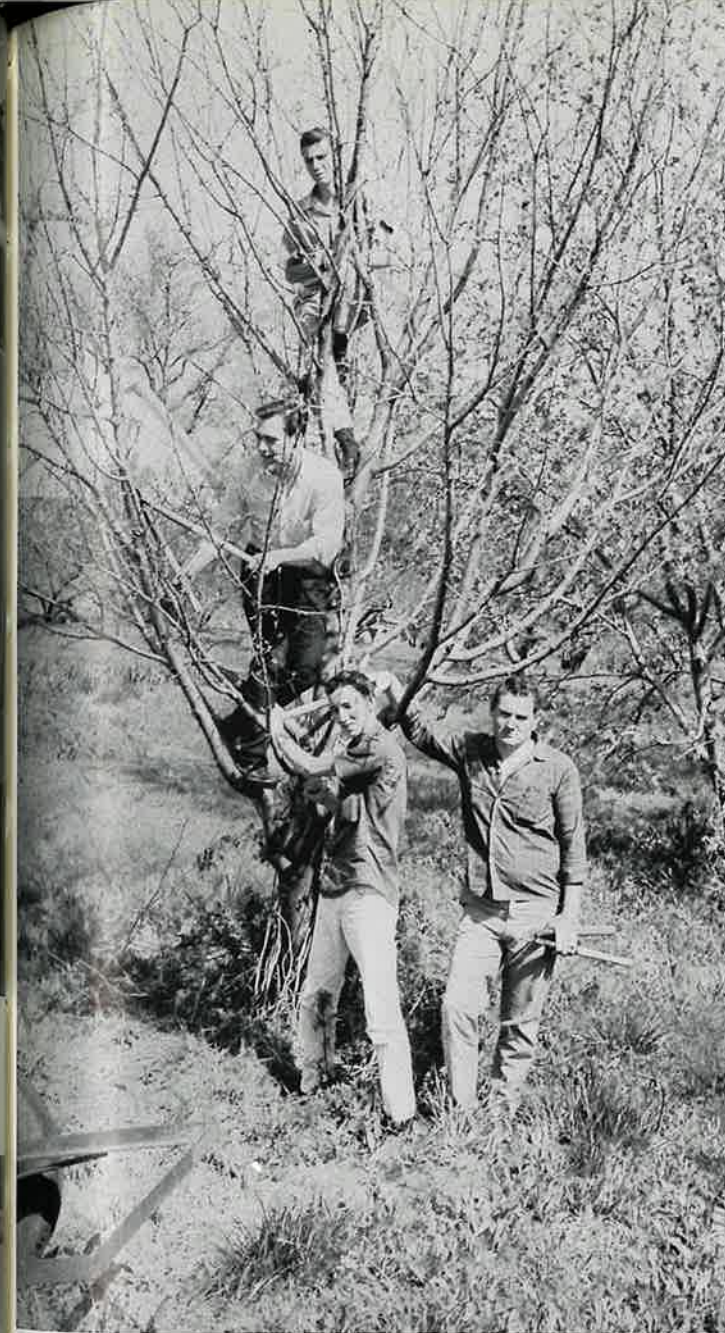
