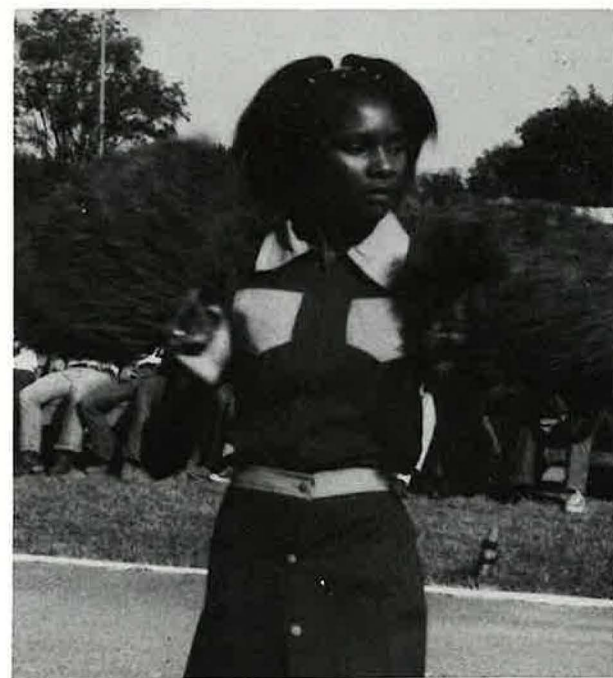
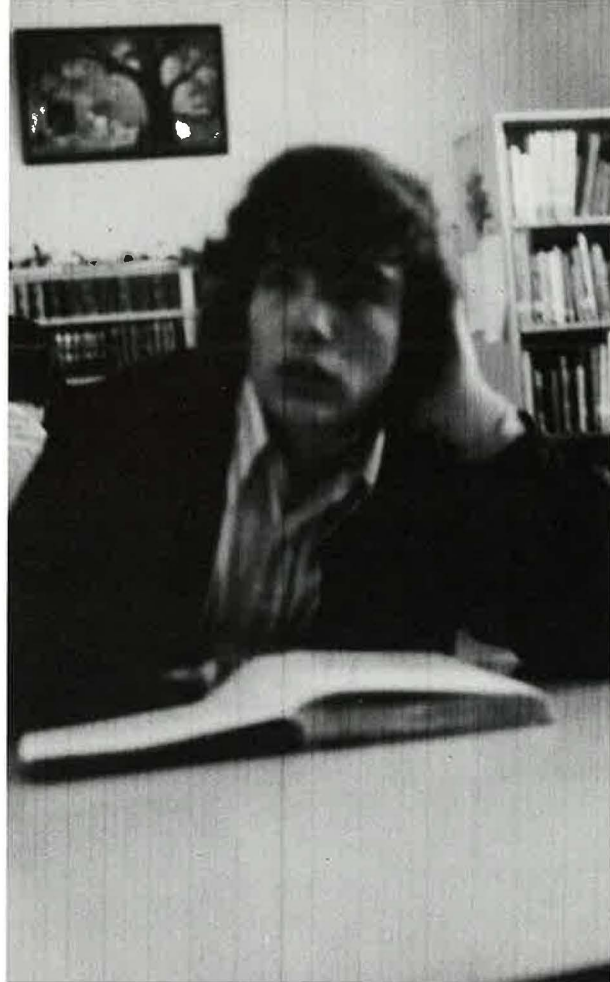




Paper "Dolls" Victorious

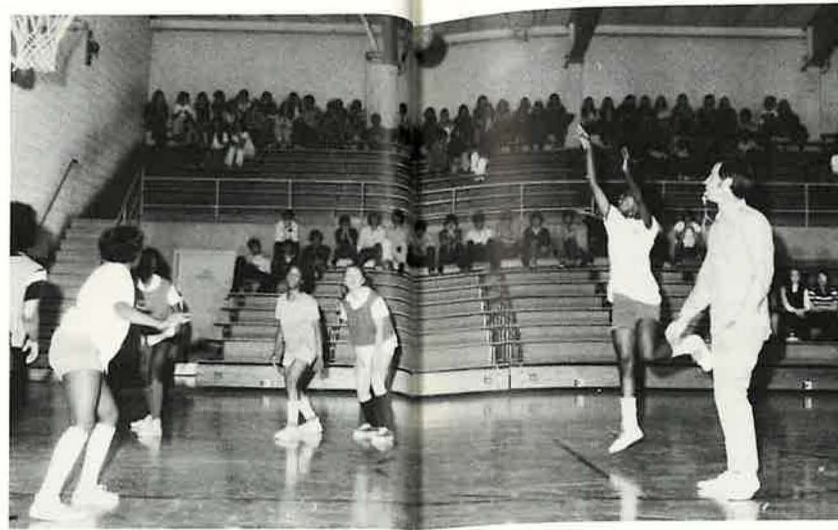
Freshmen — Sophomores Take 1st Place In Class Tournaments

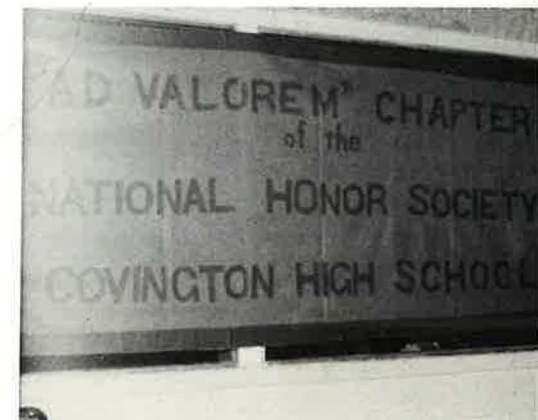

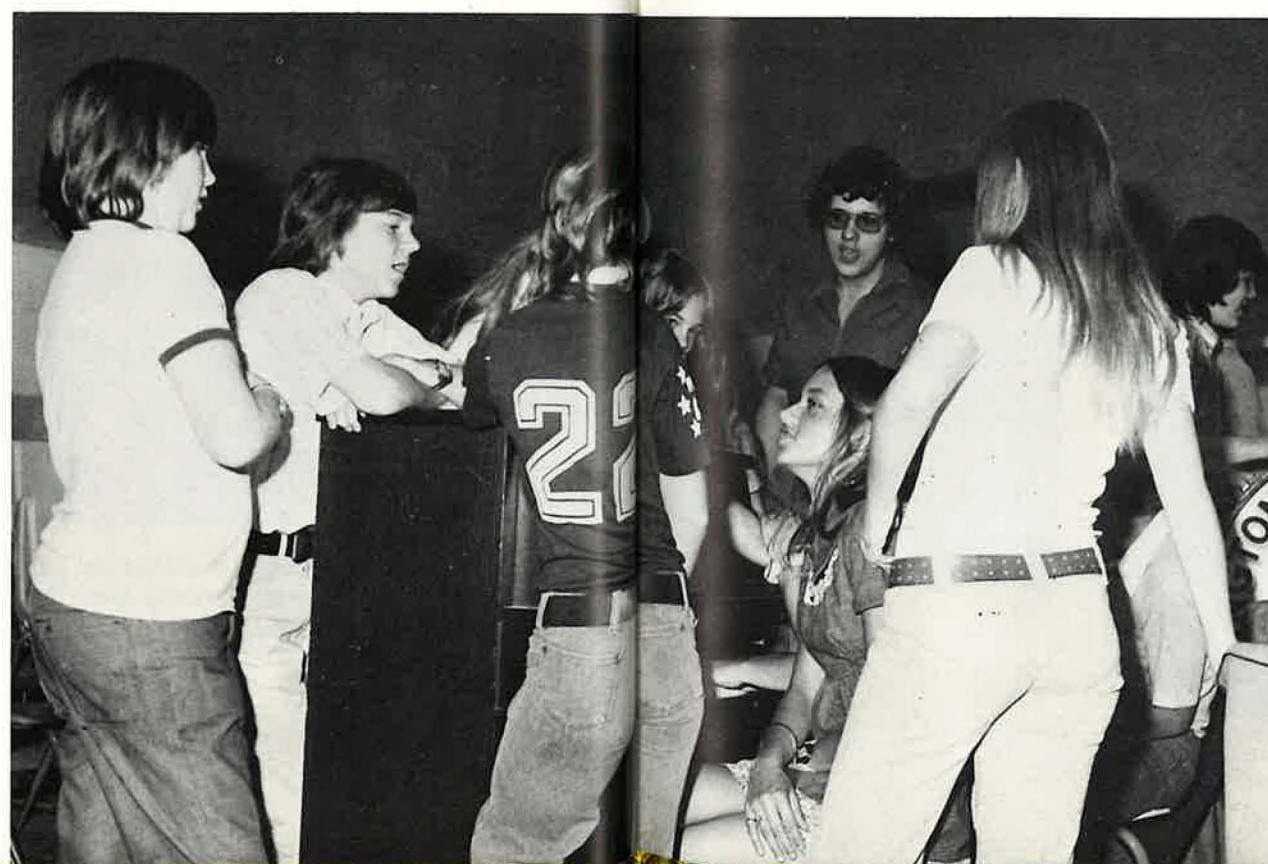
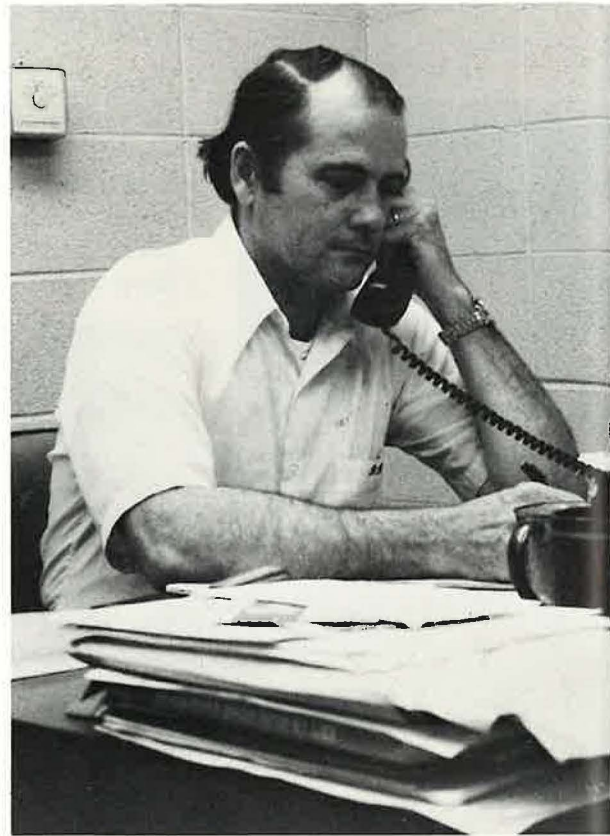

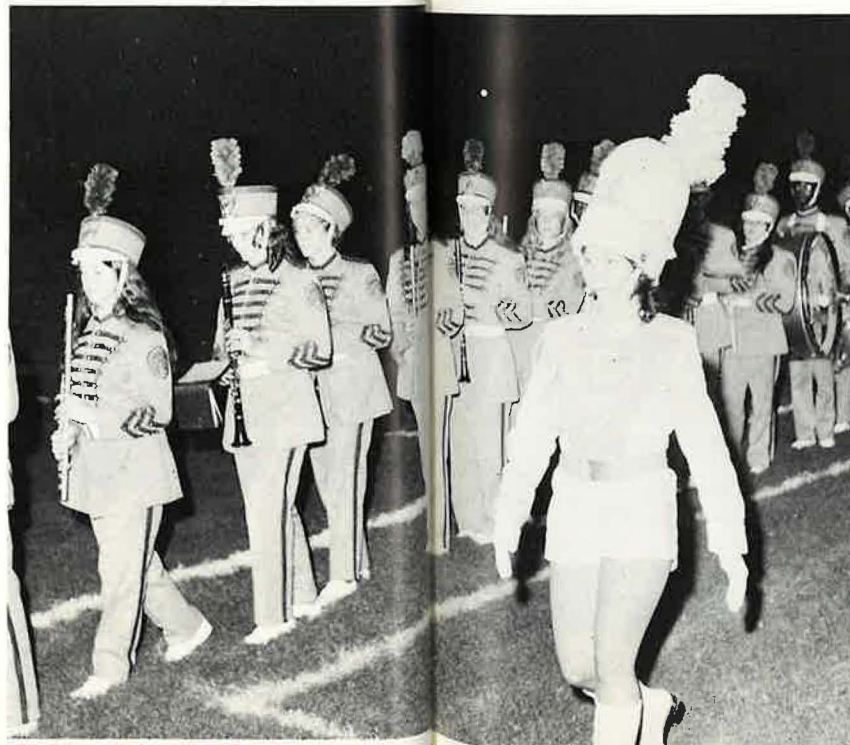

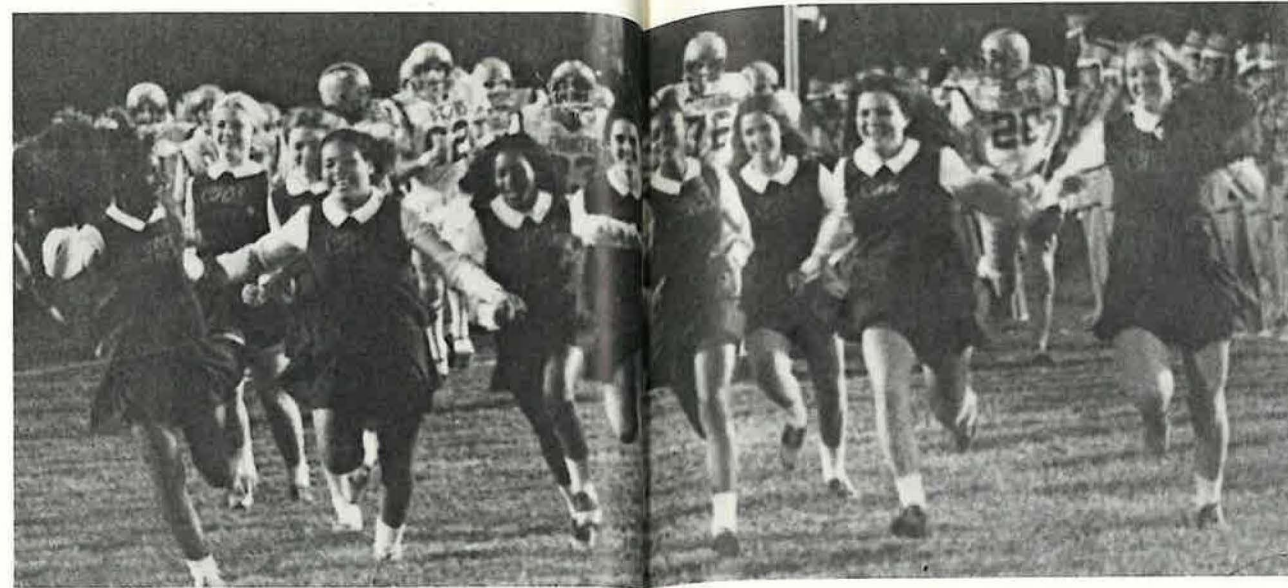

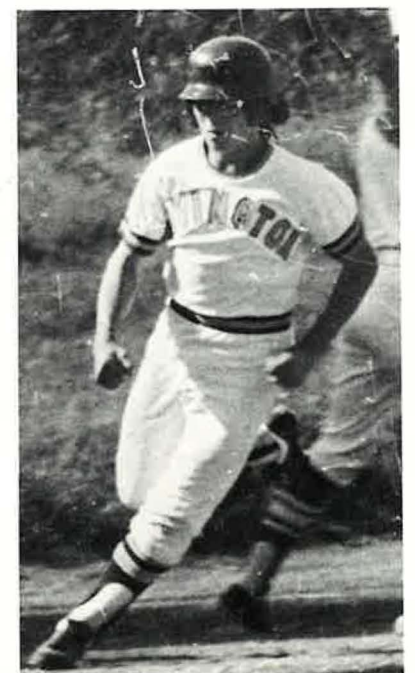
AIASA Presents Awards At Parents' Supper

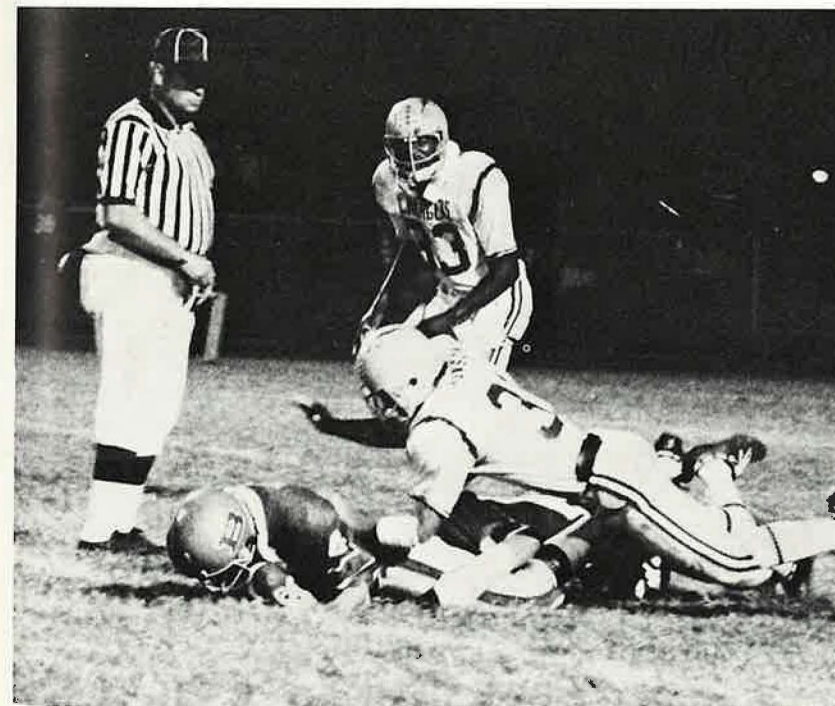
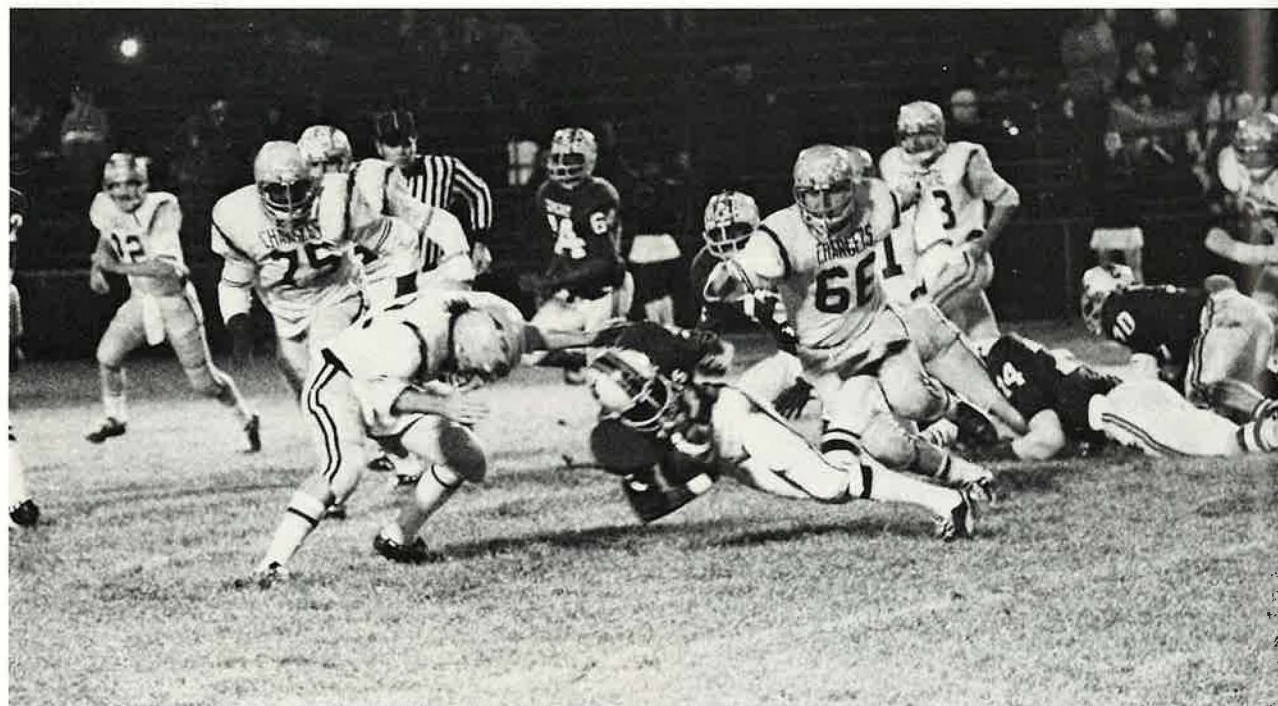
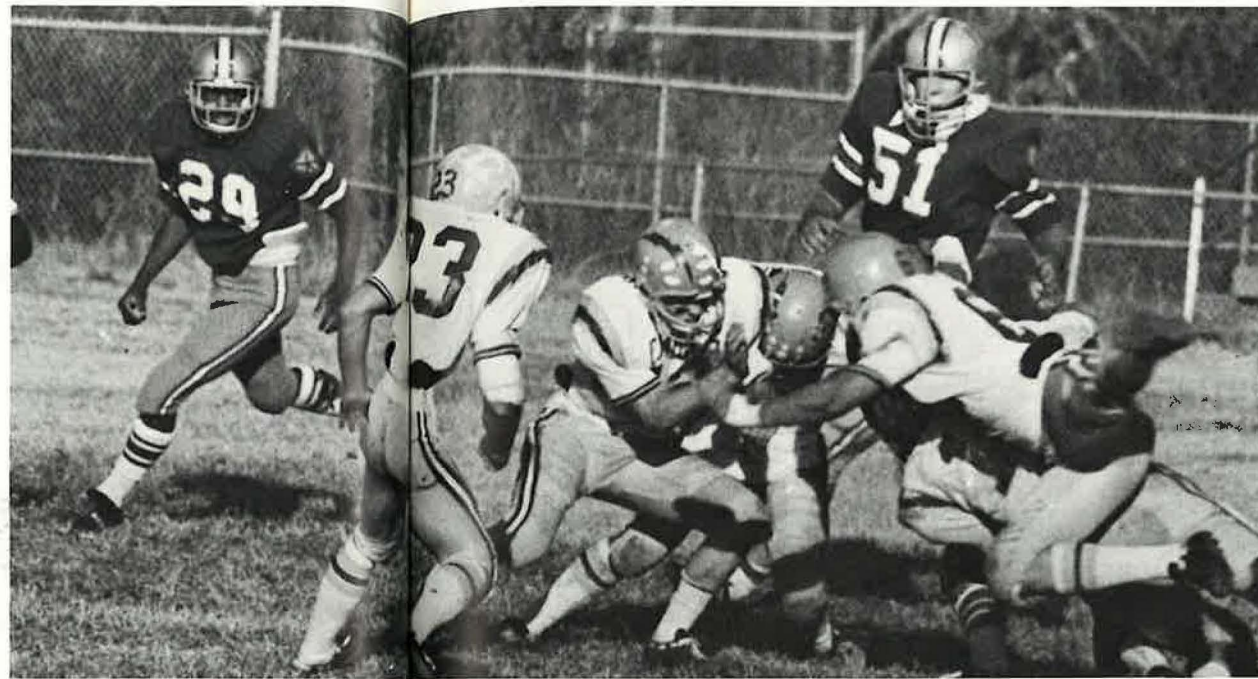
The Covington Chargers 1973 season was a most explosive one. Under the direction of head coach Jack Cain, the Chargers posted a 10-1 record while scoring 264 points and holding the opponents to 69 points. The Chargers opened the season with 40-0 triumph over Millington, but fell behind 13-14 to Dyersburg in the second game. The one point loss turned out to cost the Chargers a berth in the state playoffs. The Chargers put it all together again and went on to win the remaining regular season games and earned a tie for the Big Ten Title. The Chargers unable to participate in the state playoffs, accepted a bid to the Metro Bowl in Antioch where they played Father Ryan of Nashville. The Chargers romped the middle Tennessee team 32-22 to give them a 2-0 record against teams from middle Tennessee.

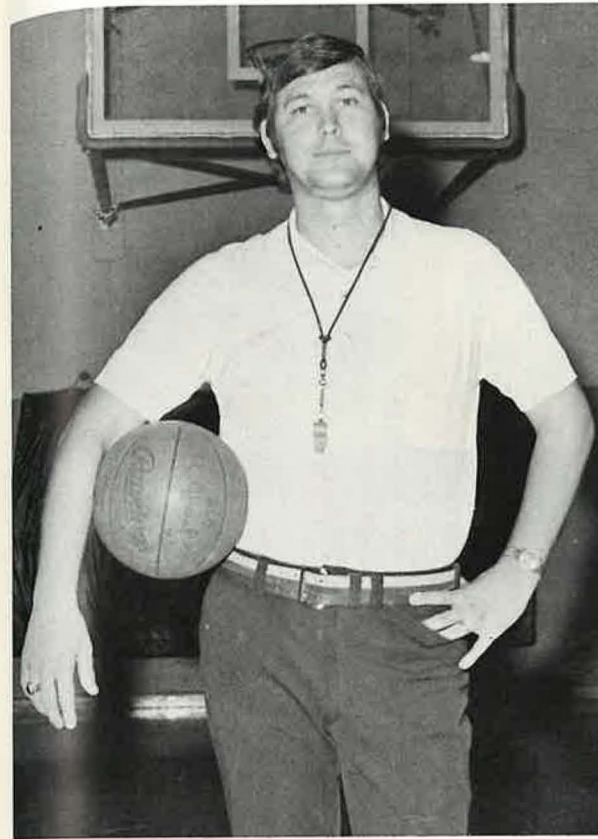

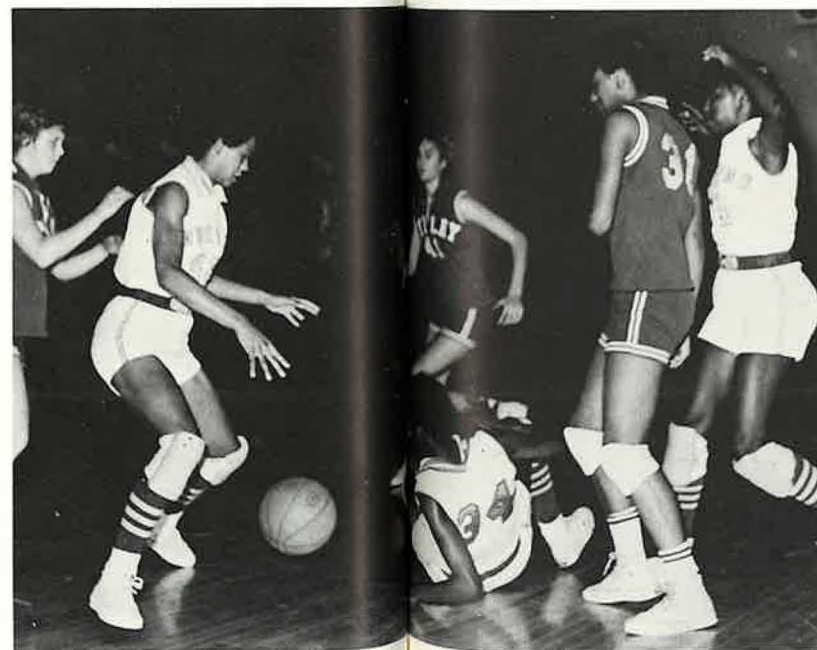

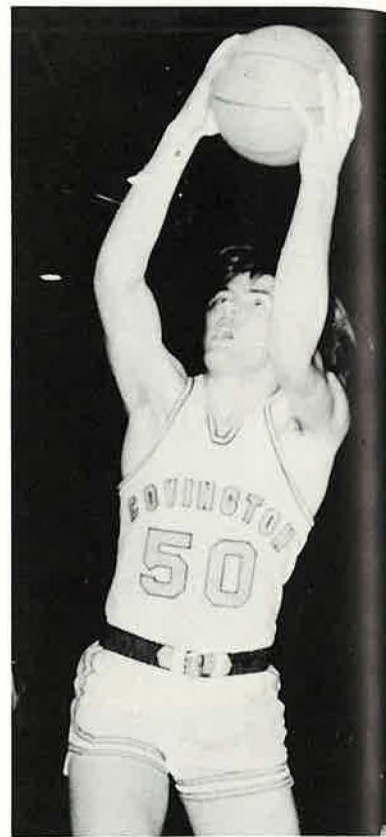

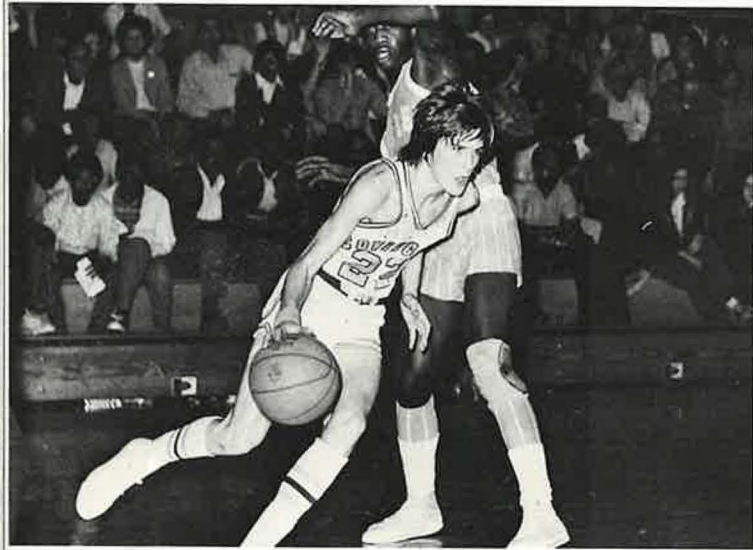

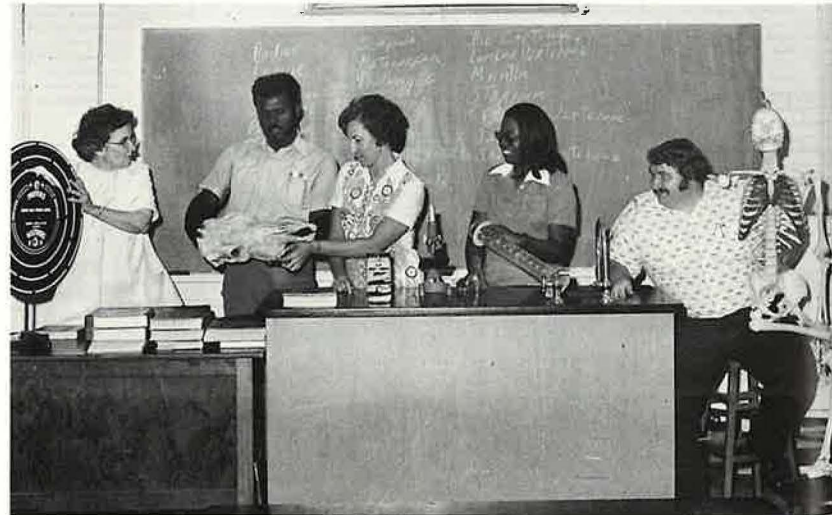
