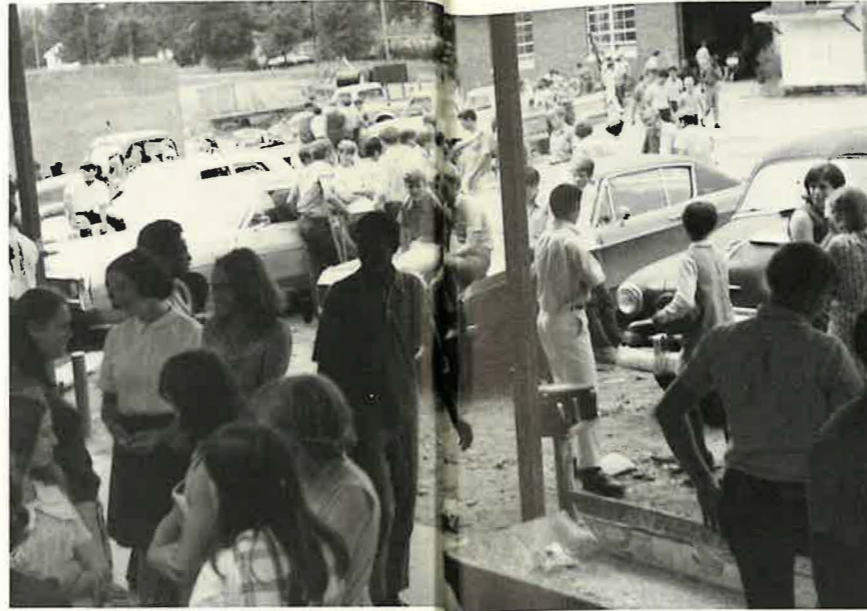






Confusion

Stalks Covington High School

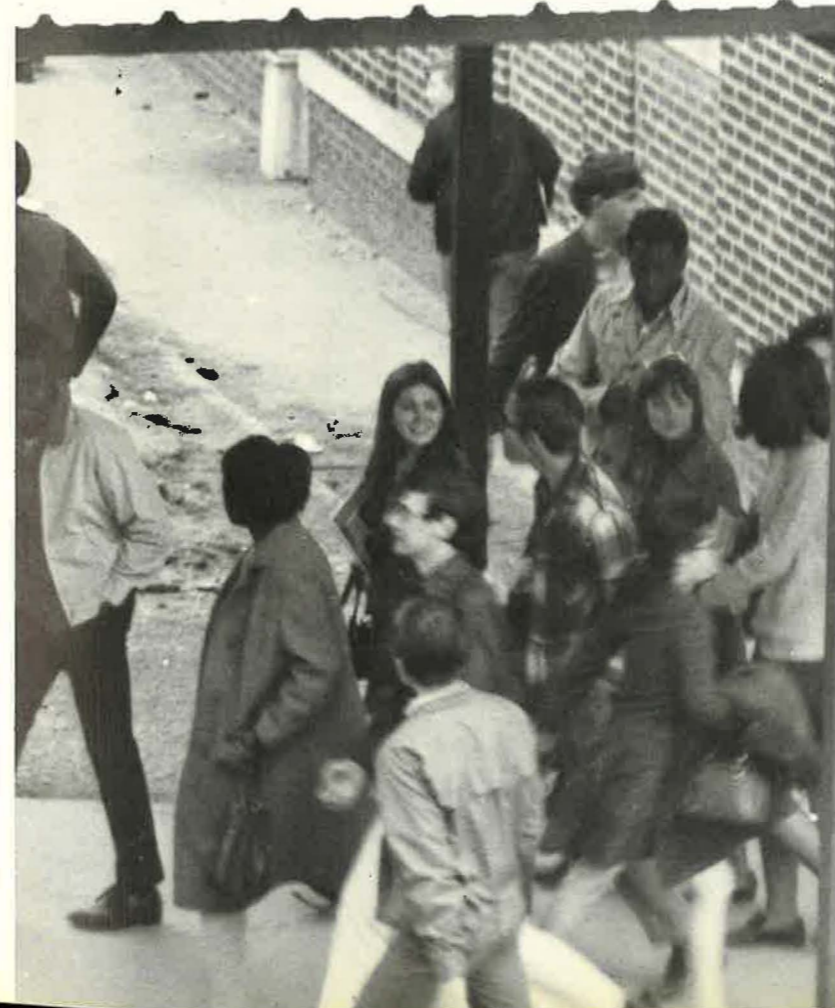


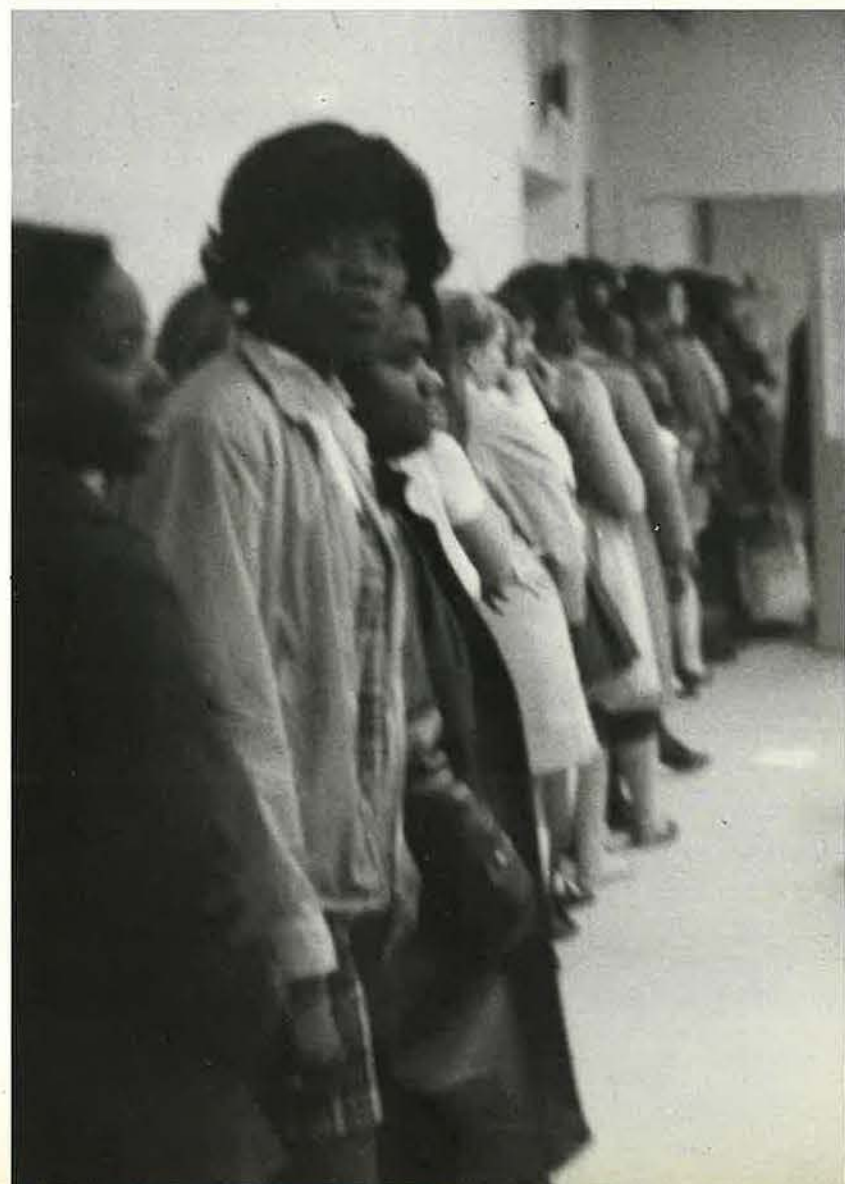

Cathcart Makes Changes

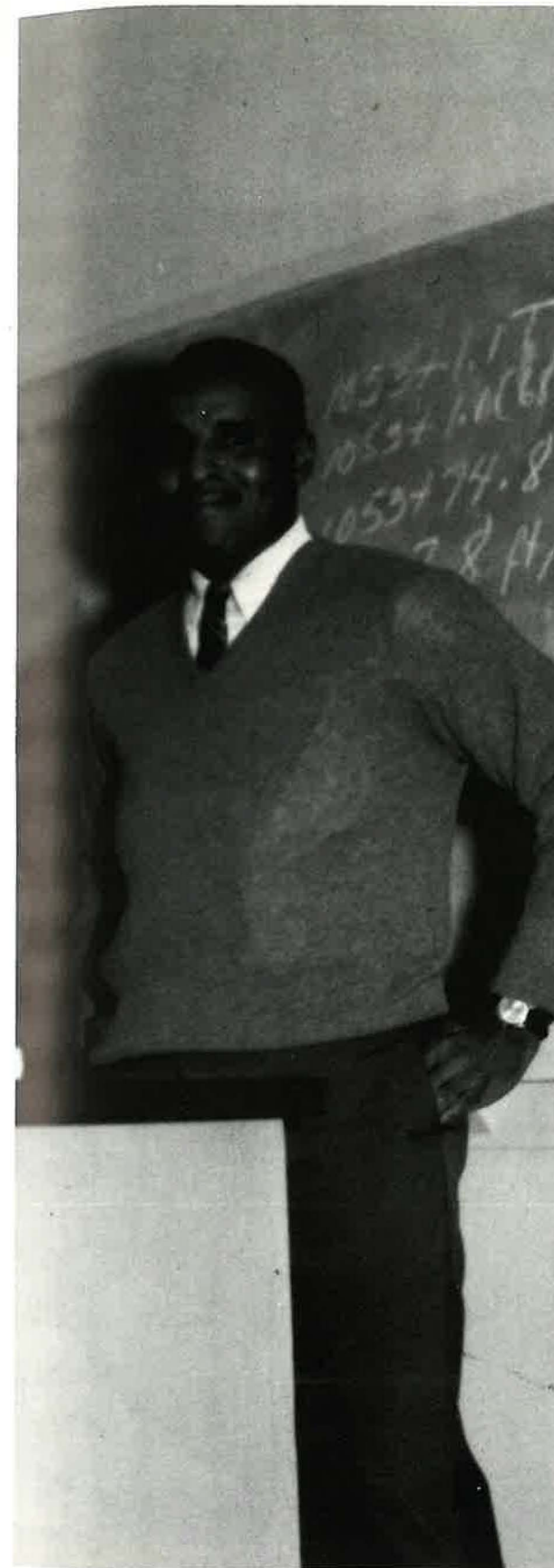

Dudley, Lindsey Enforce Policies

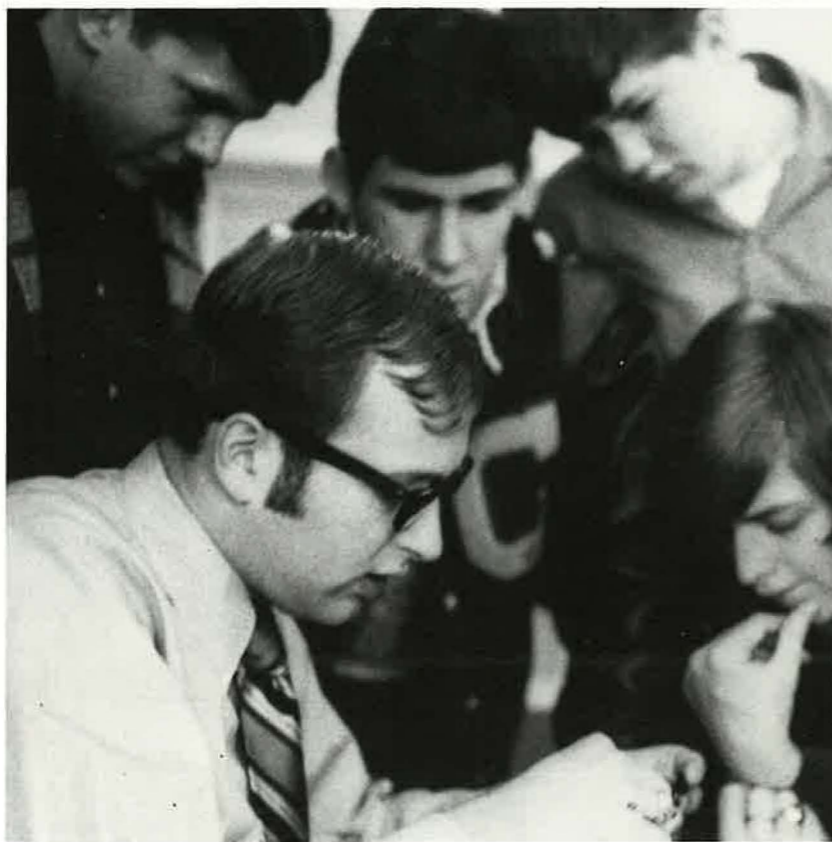

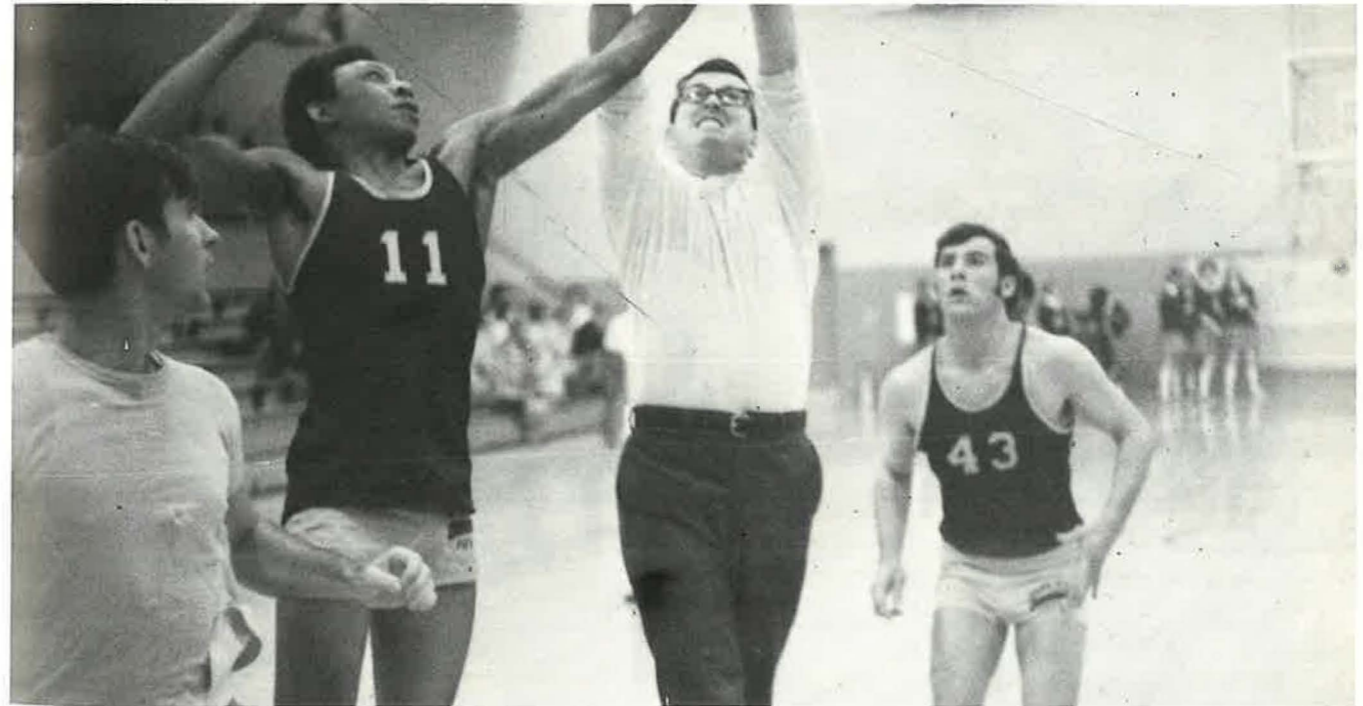
Math Teachers Calculate a Perfect Shot

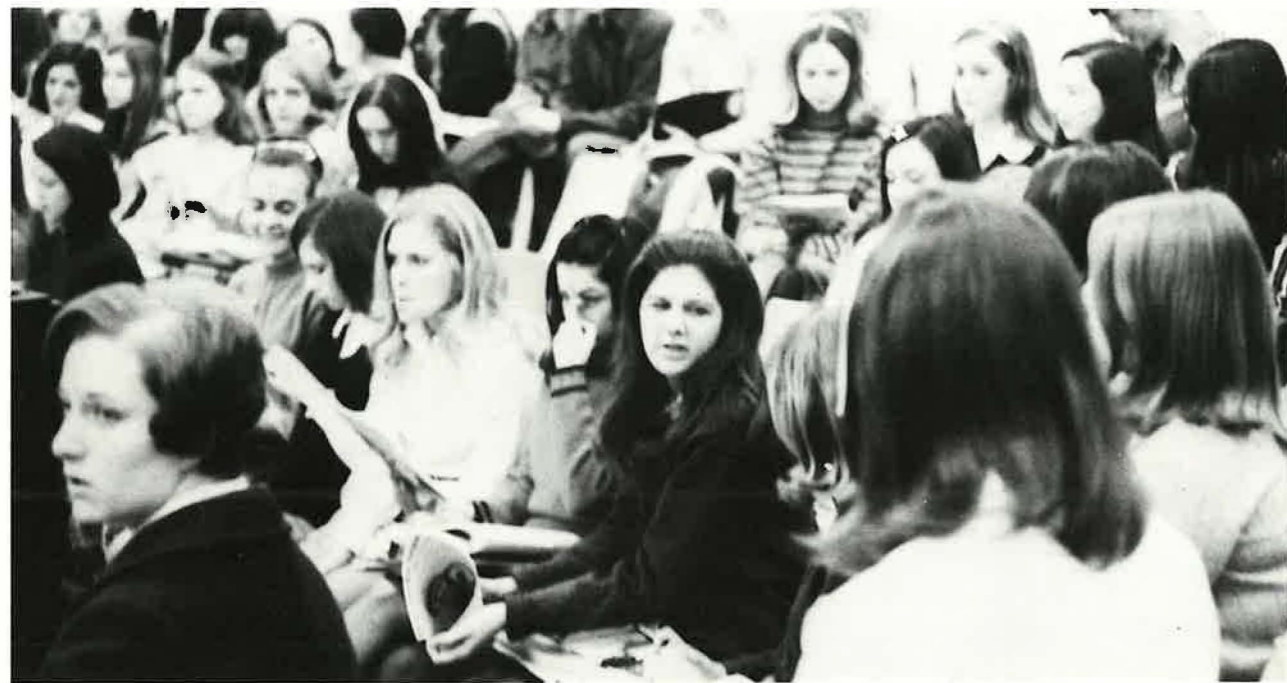

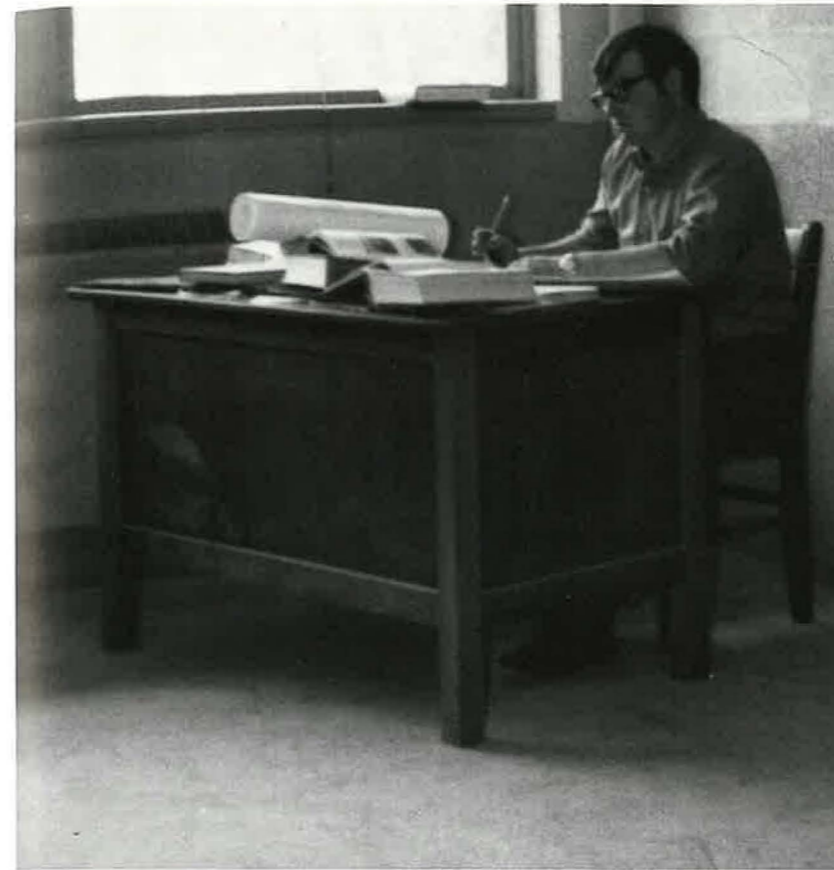

By working and by cooperating closely together, the council acted as a mediator between the faculty and the students and succeeded in making the first year of Covington High School an enjoyable one for all.

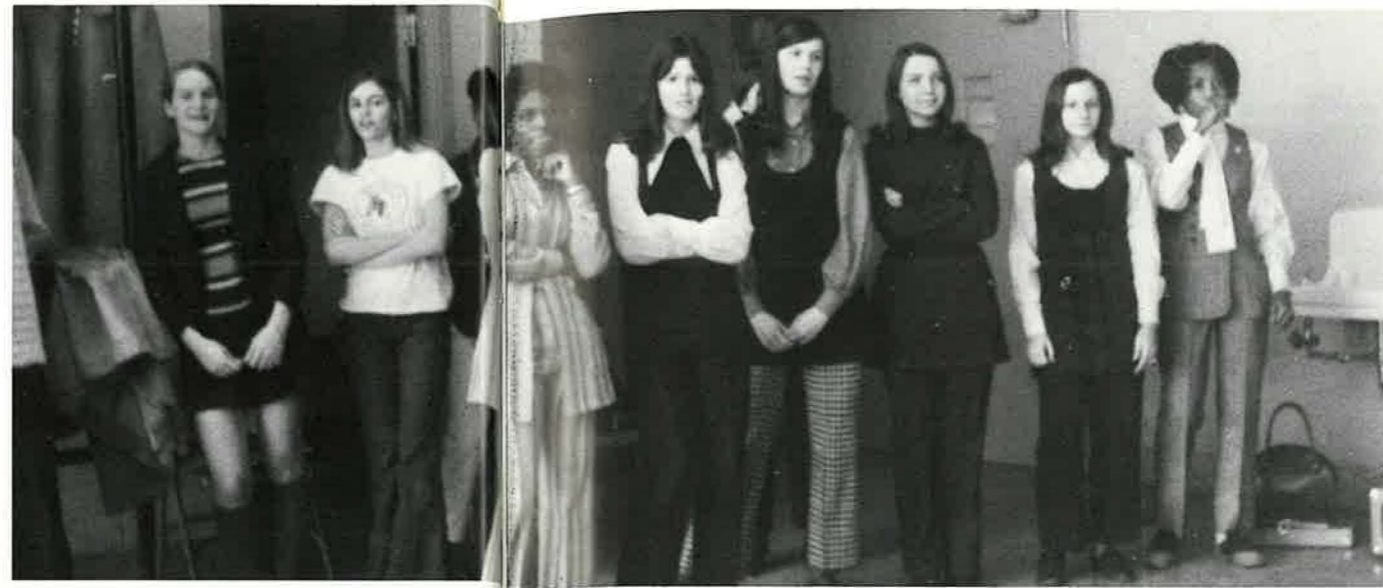

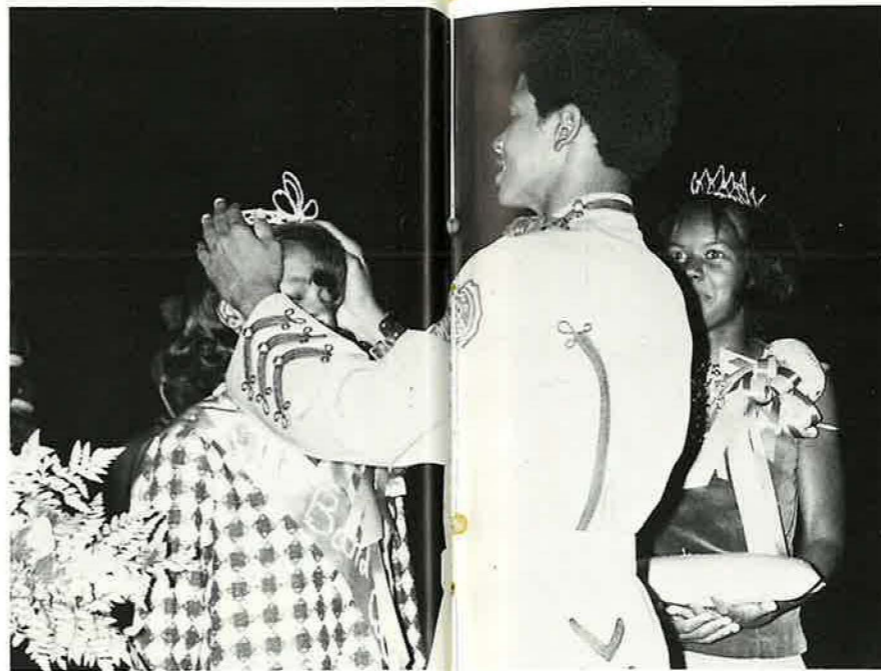

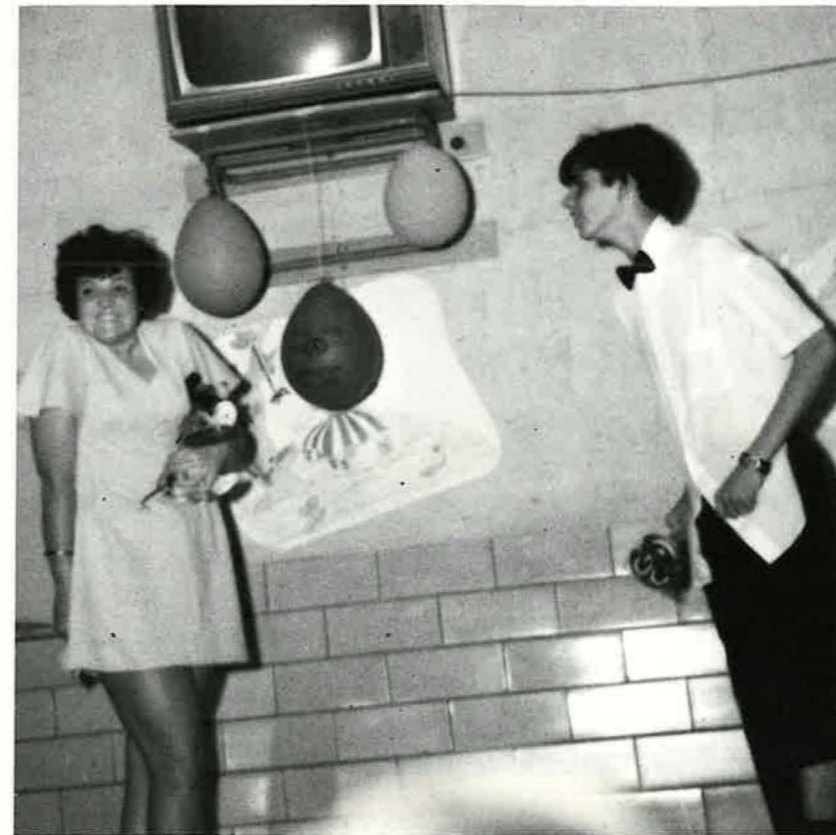

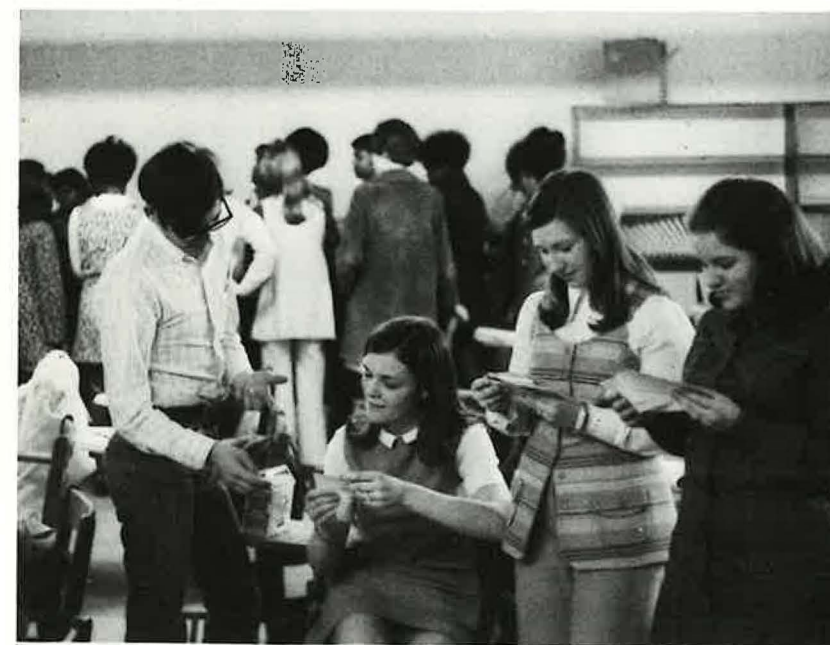
Taylor Publishing Company sponsored a yearbook seminar at Lambuth College in March. The seminar answered many questions and helped to give the yearbook more spirit.



Spirit Takes Hard Work

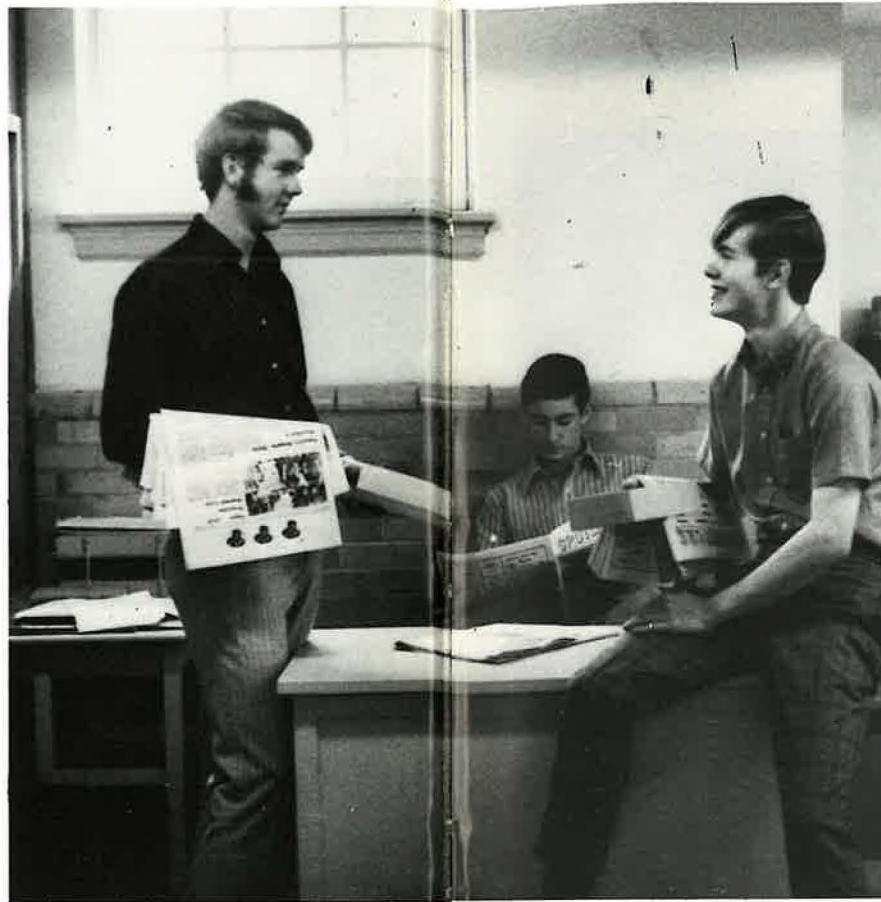

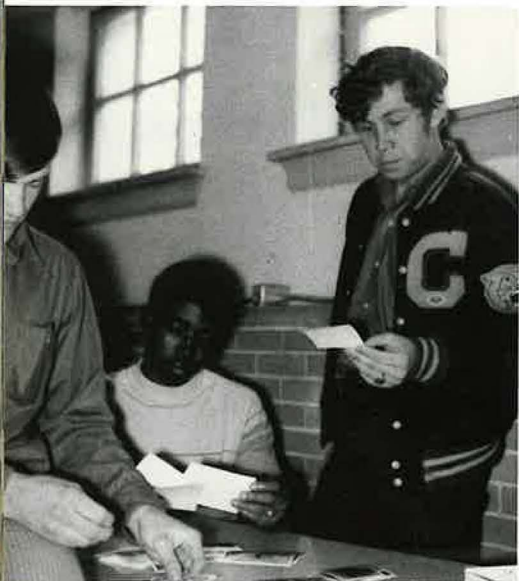


New Paper Spotlights New School

The captains were elected by the cheerleaders. The football captain was Anita Cox. Cyndi Tanner led the basketball cheerleaders.

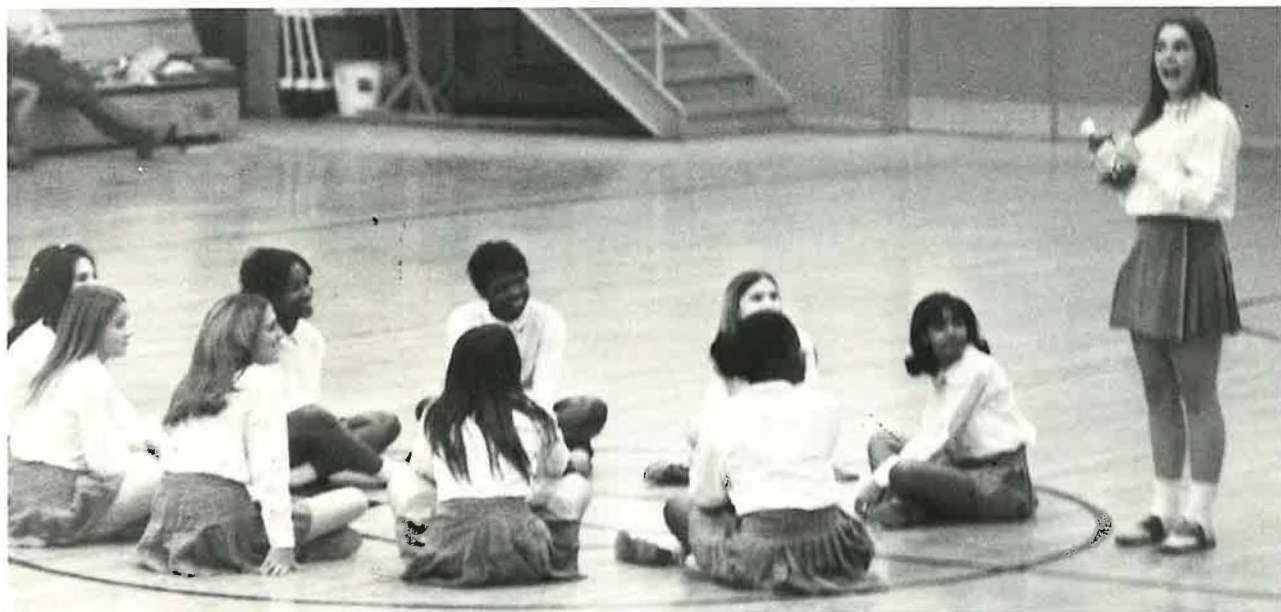

Students Gain Teaching Experience

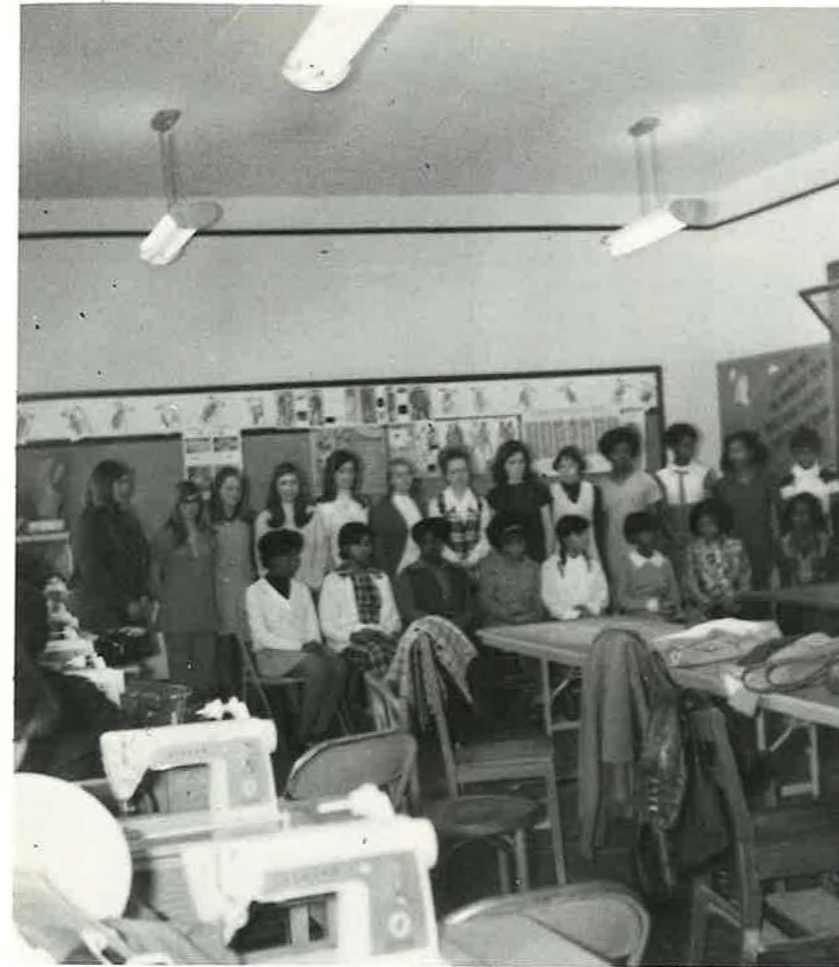

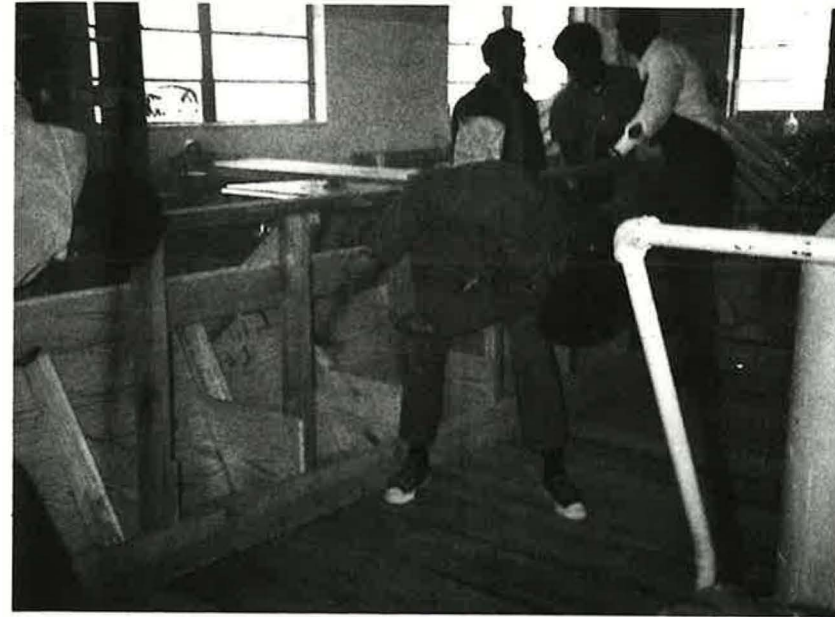

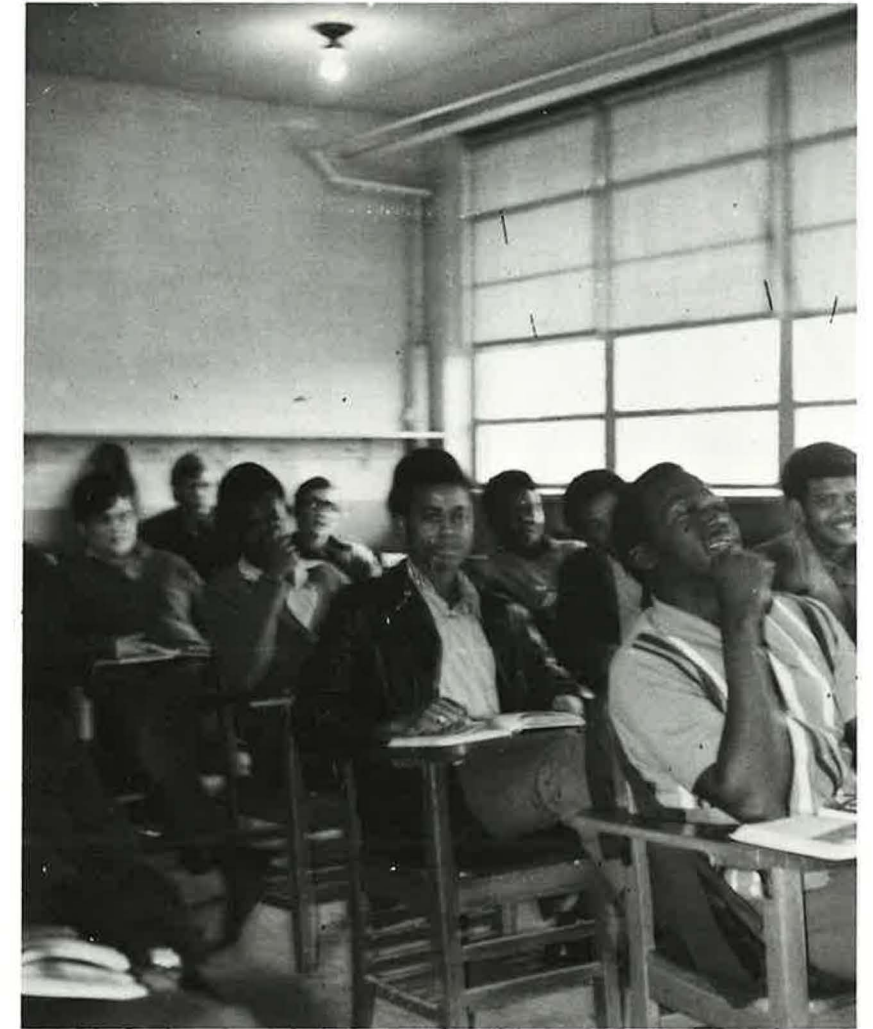
Future Farmers on the Move

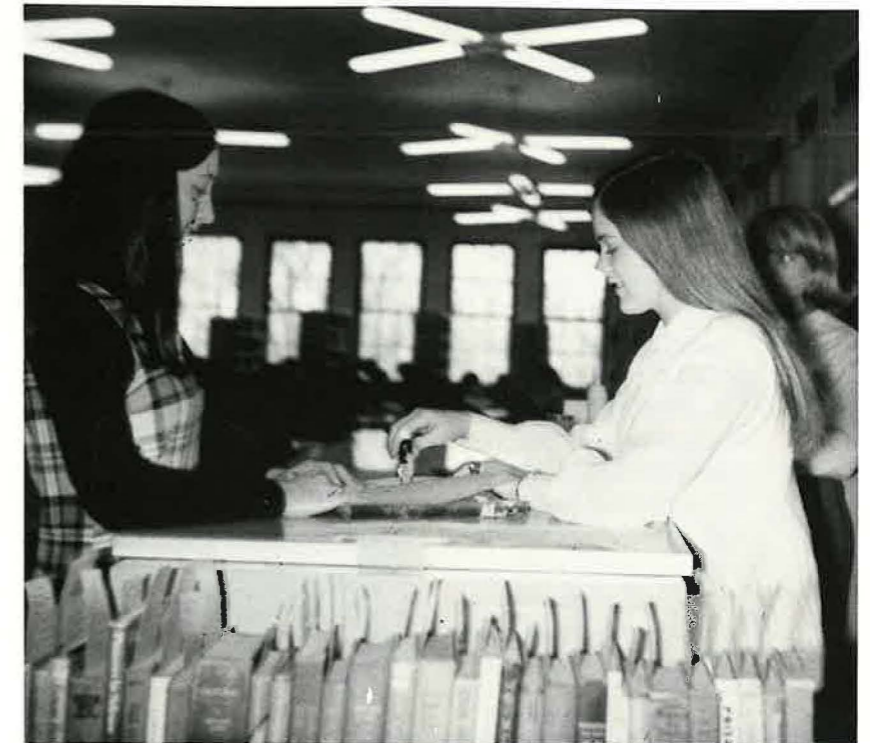


Student Assistants

Betty Crocker Award

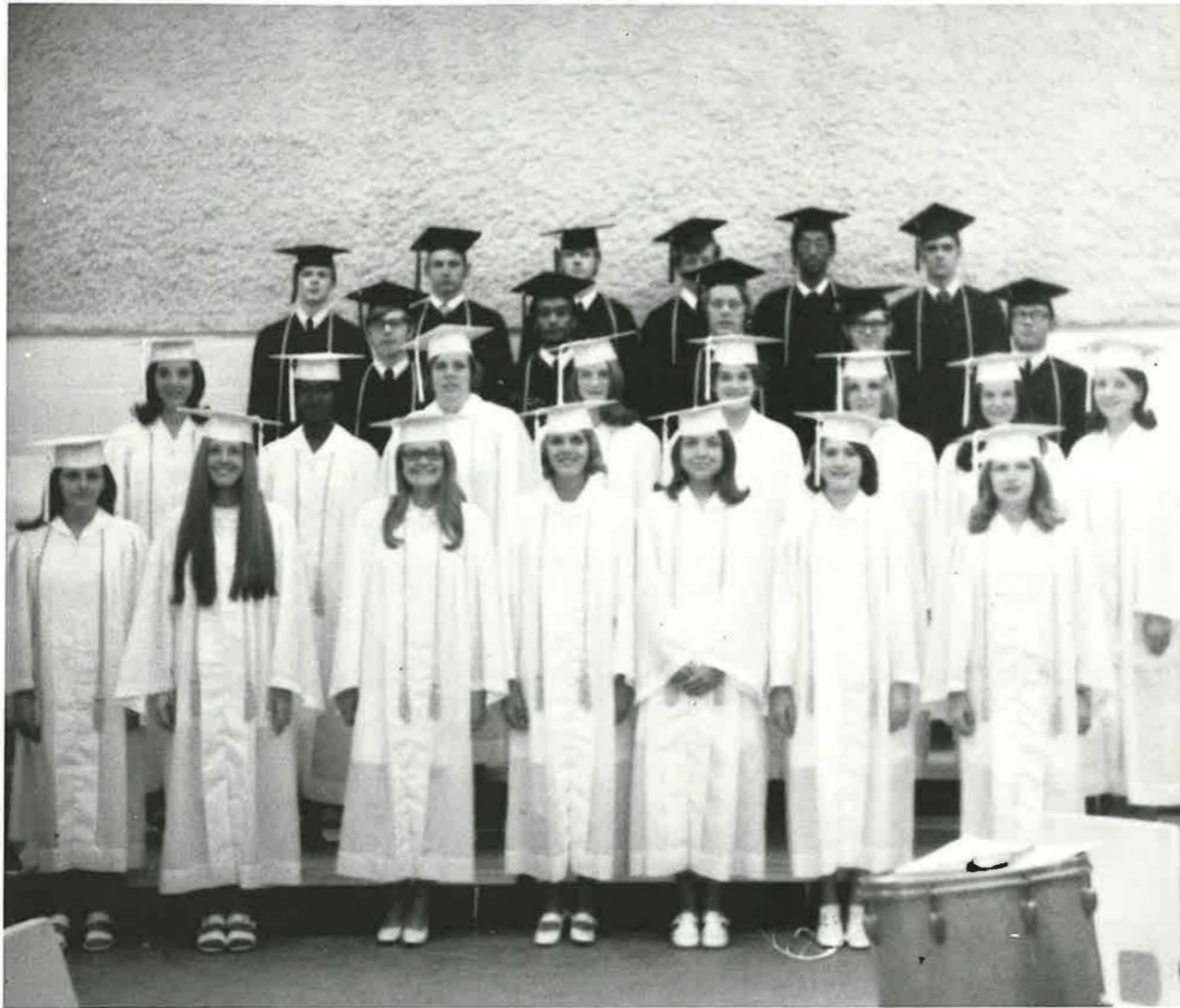
All the senior girls this year were required to take a Betty Crocker test, which determined their abilities as future homemakers. The award was given to the girl who achieved the highest score in each school participating.

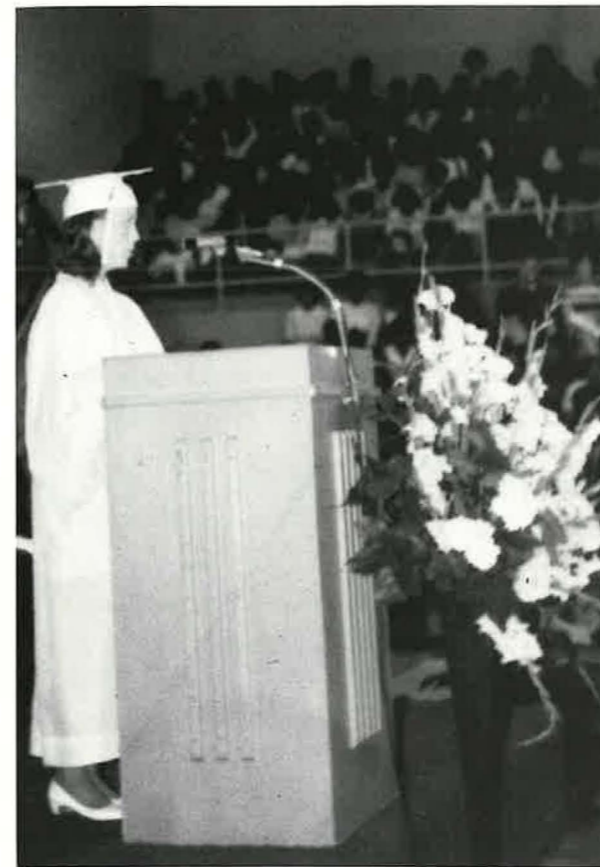

Dennis Black, Next in Line

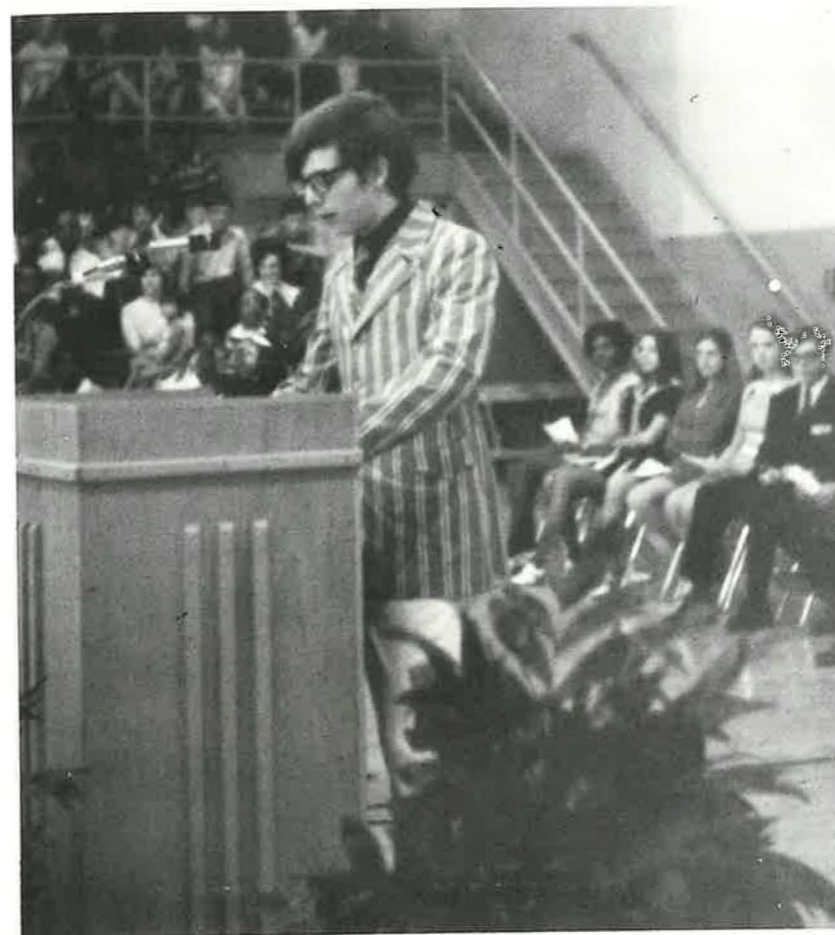
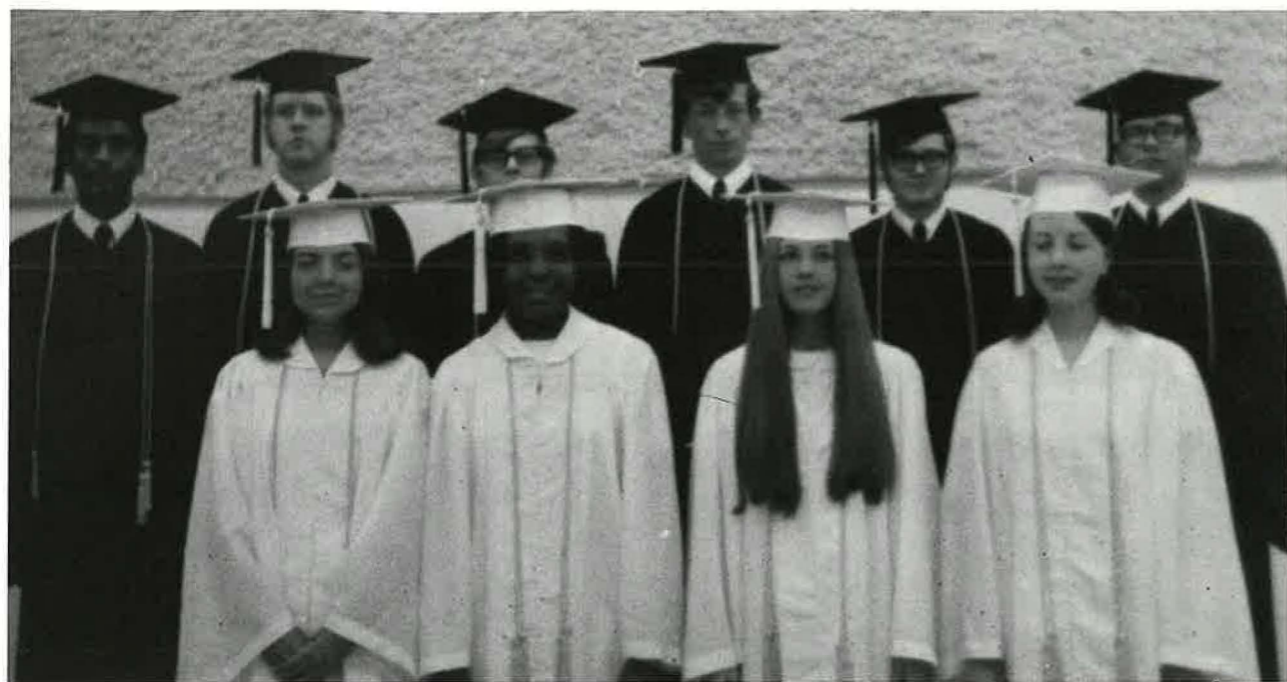
The honored position of salutatorian went to Dennis Black. Even though much of Dennis' time has been devoted to his academic work, he has found time for many extracurricular activities.

Because of Dennis' excellence in the science field, he was appointed to the National Science Foundation's Summer Institute. He was also presented the Science award at graduation exercises.

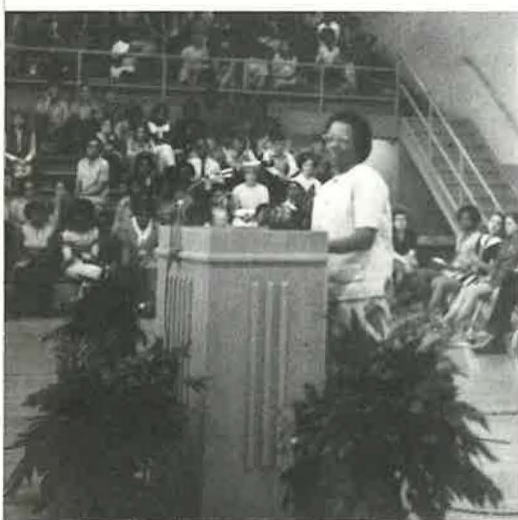




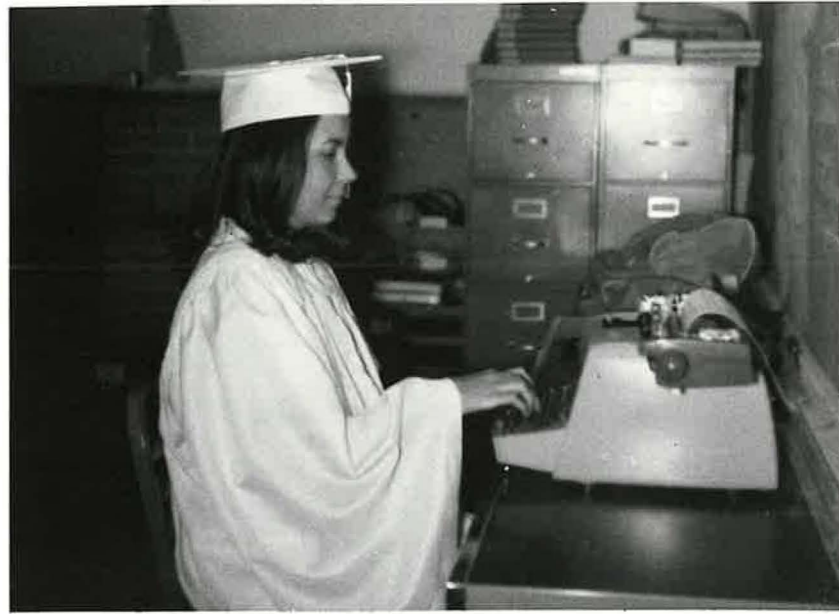
CHS Holds First Recognition Day

Due to the number in our class and the number of achievements reached, Covington High celebrated its first Recognition Day. At this program students received various honors for the goals they had reached.

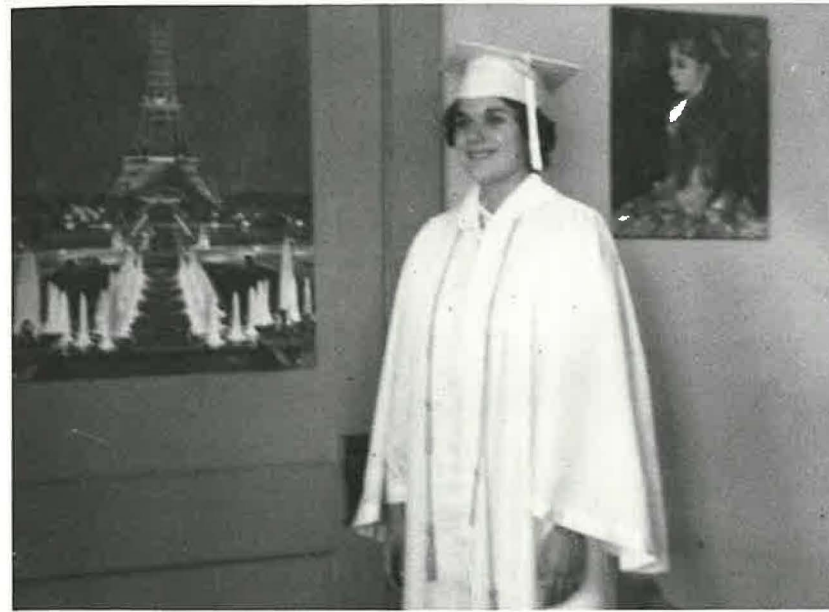

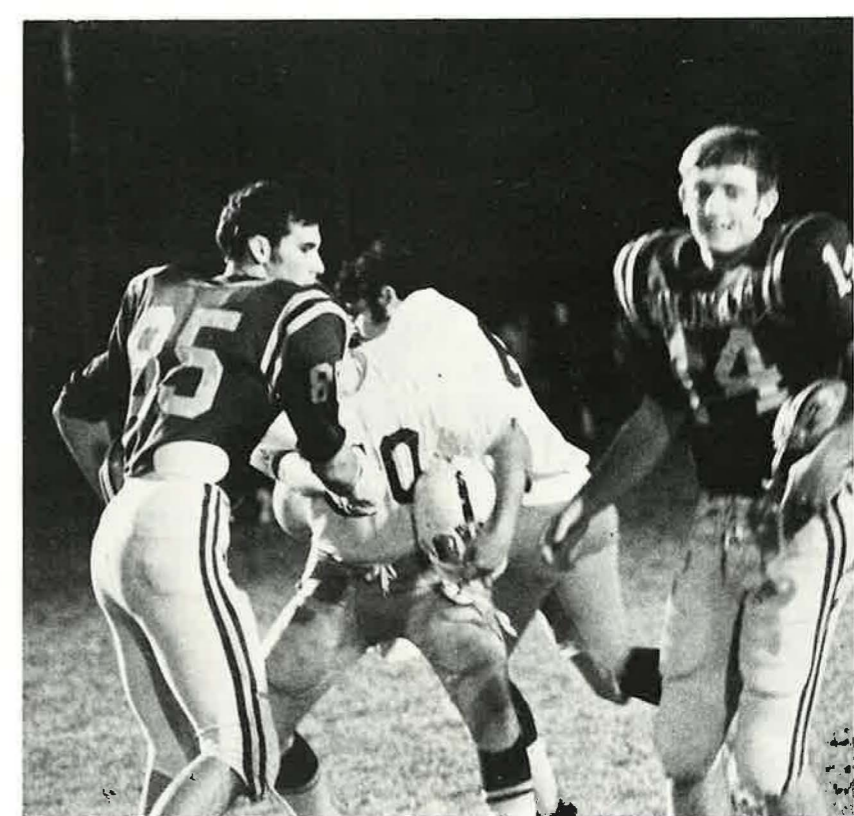
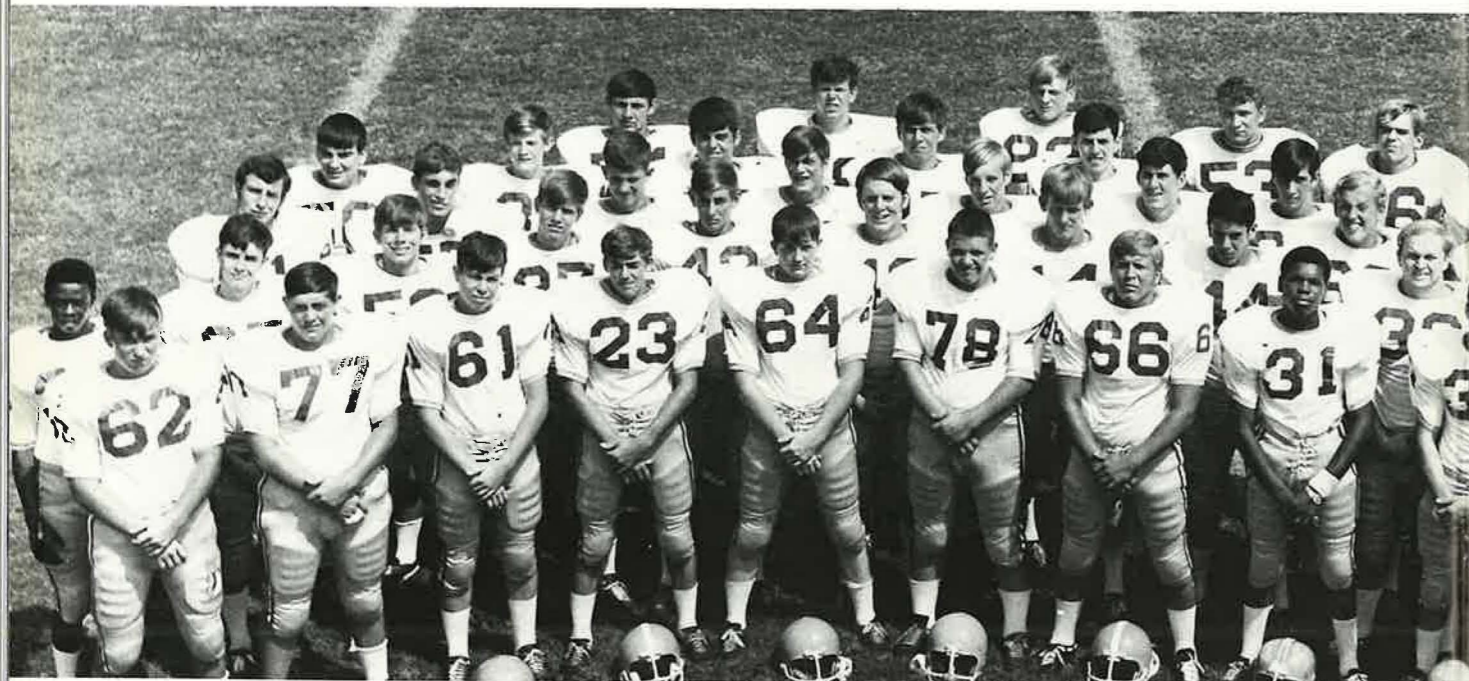
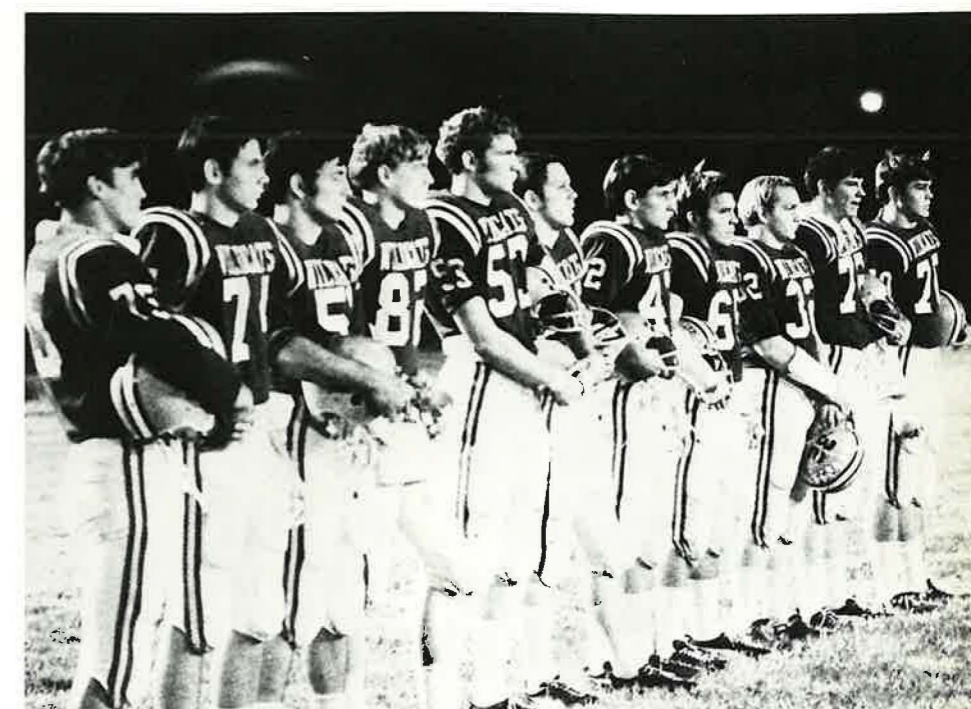
Senior Football Players

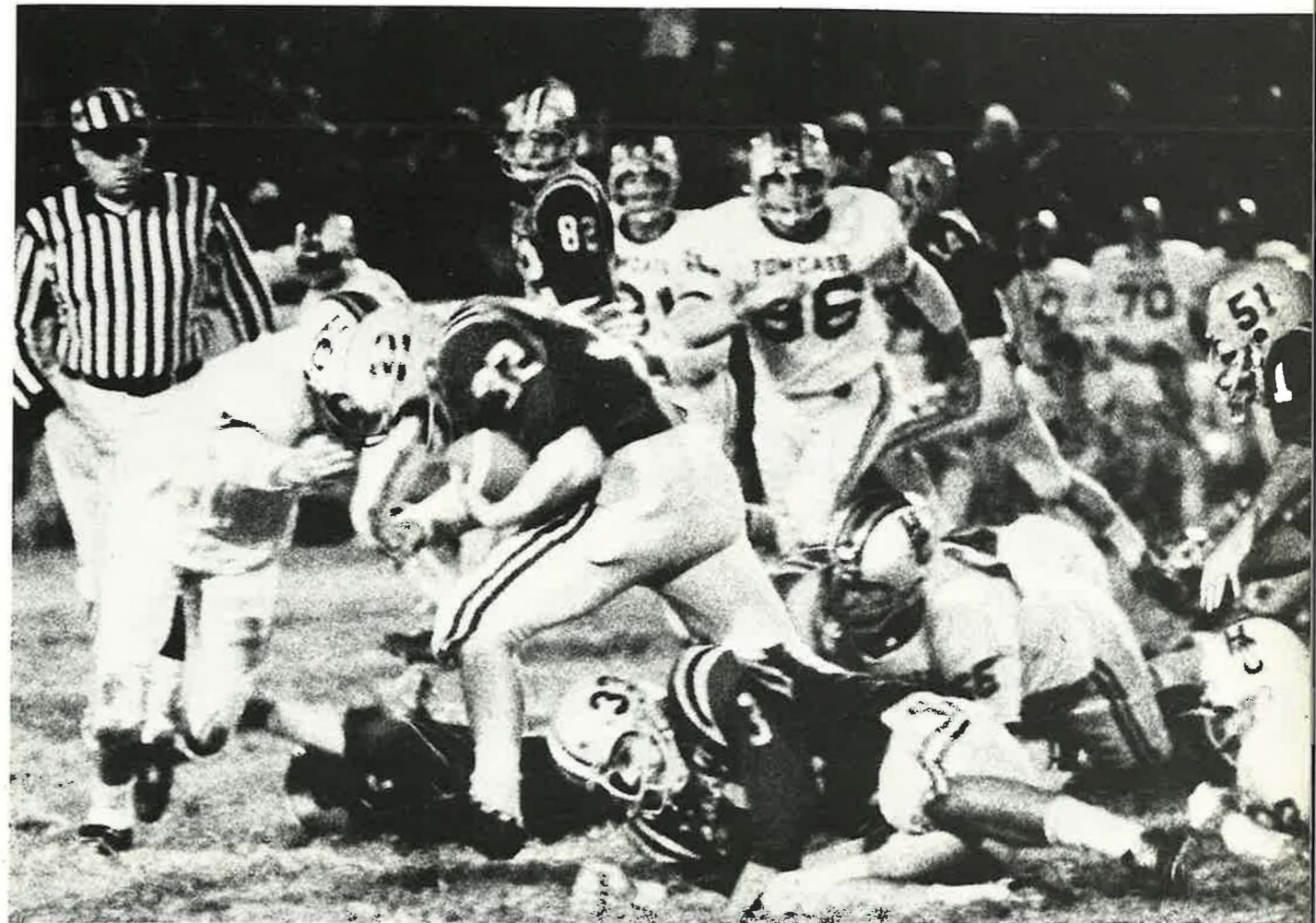
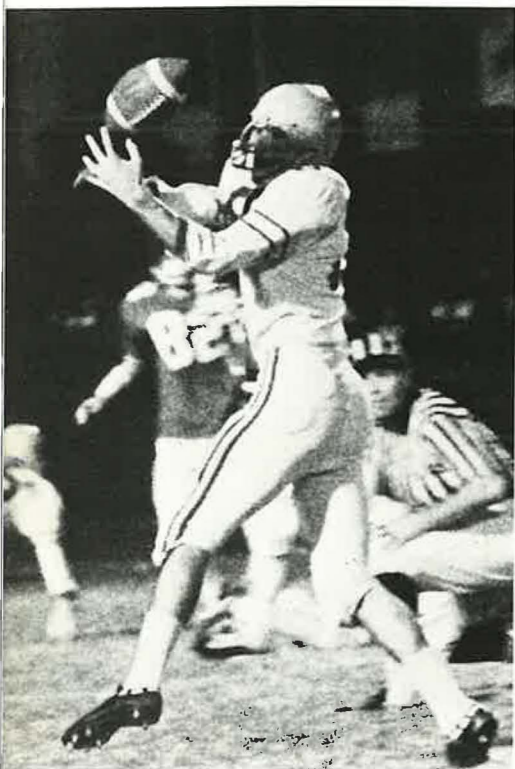
The leading scorer for the season was Senior tailback Tim Posey who totaled 38 points this year. The leading rusher was Jim Baddour who rambled for 680 yards.

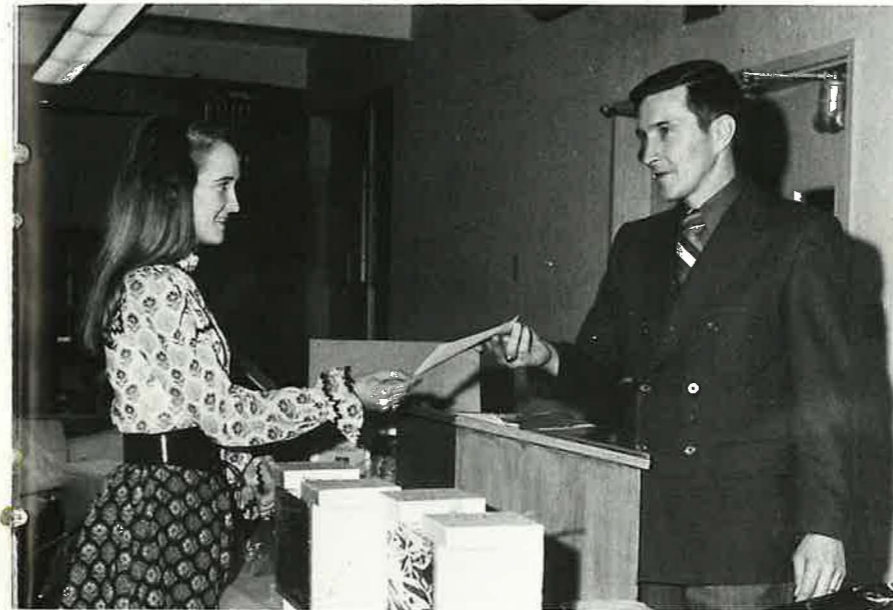

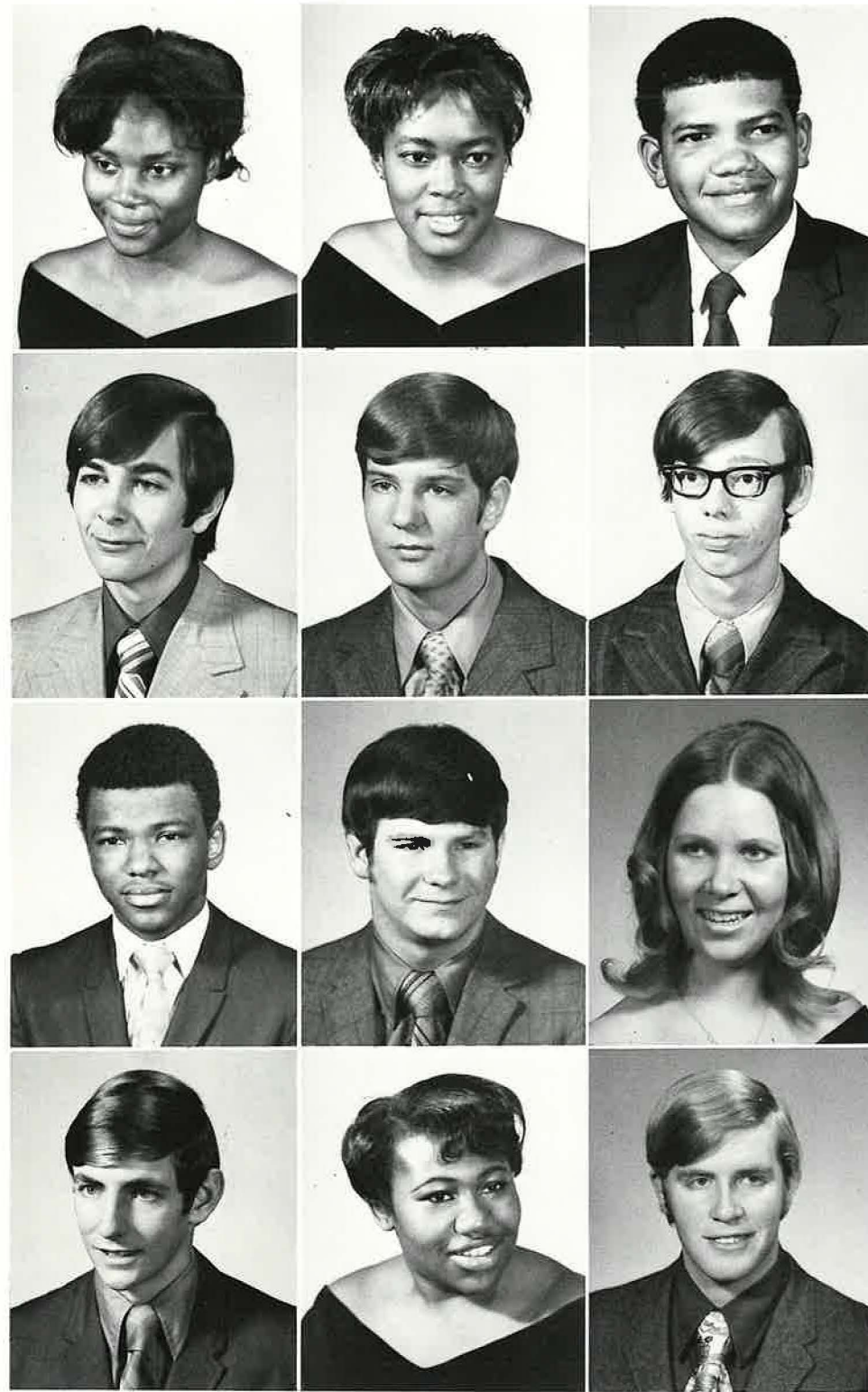

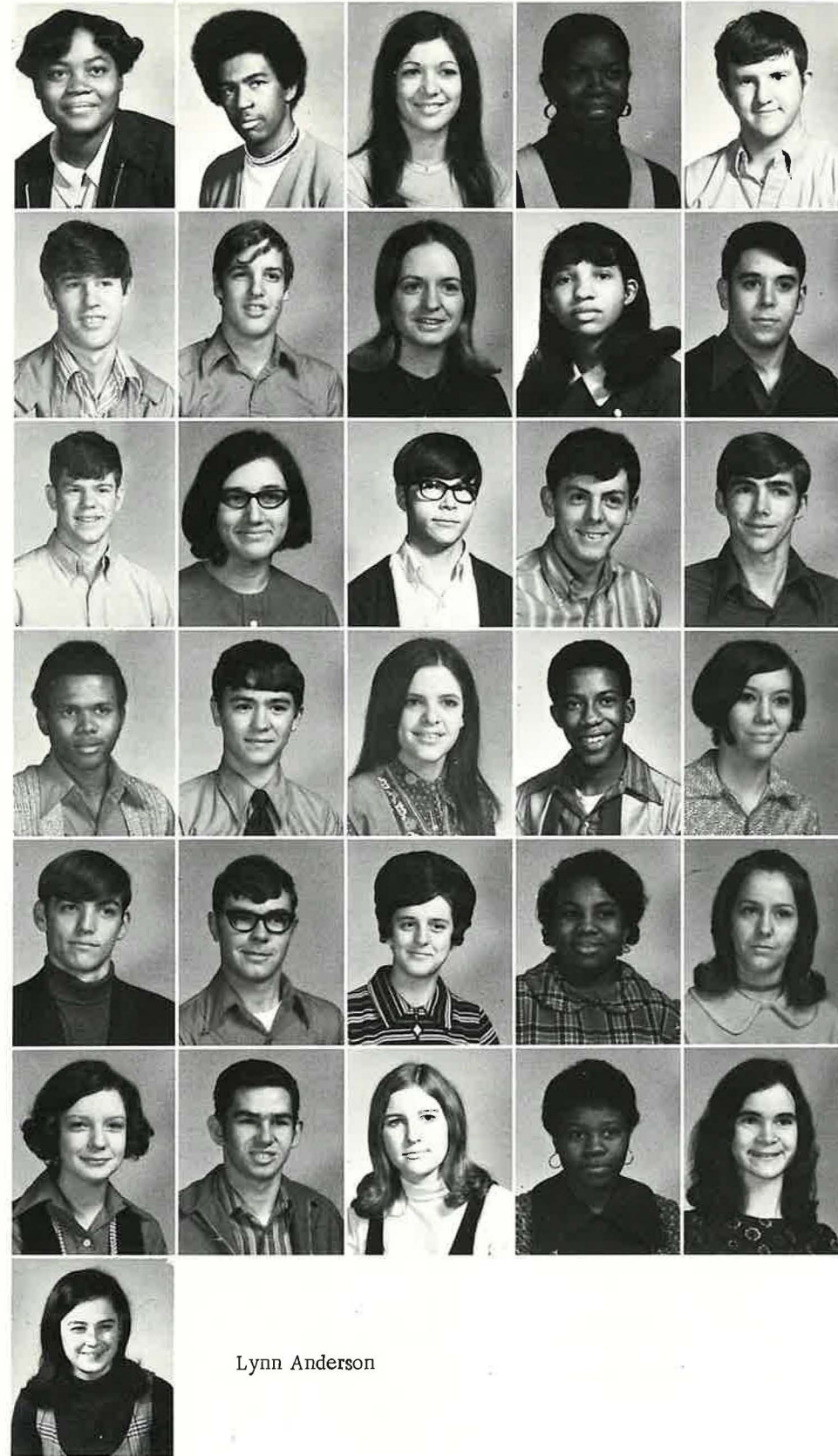
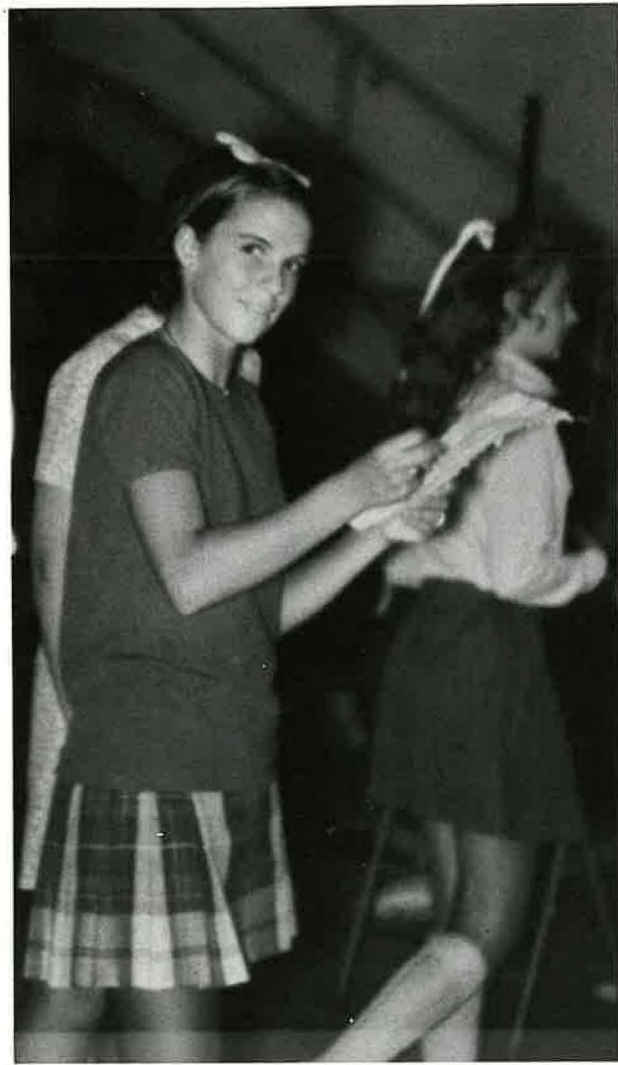
The first Junior class to attend CHS is the 1970-71 class. There are two hundred ninety-one students enrolled. Many new faces and new activities were experienced this year.

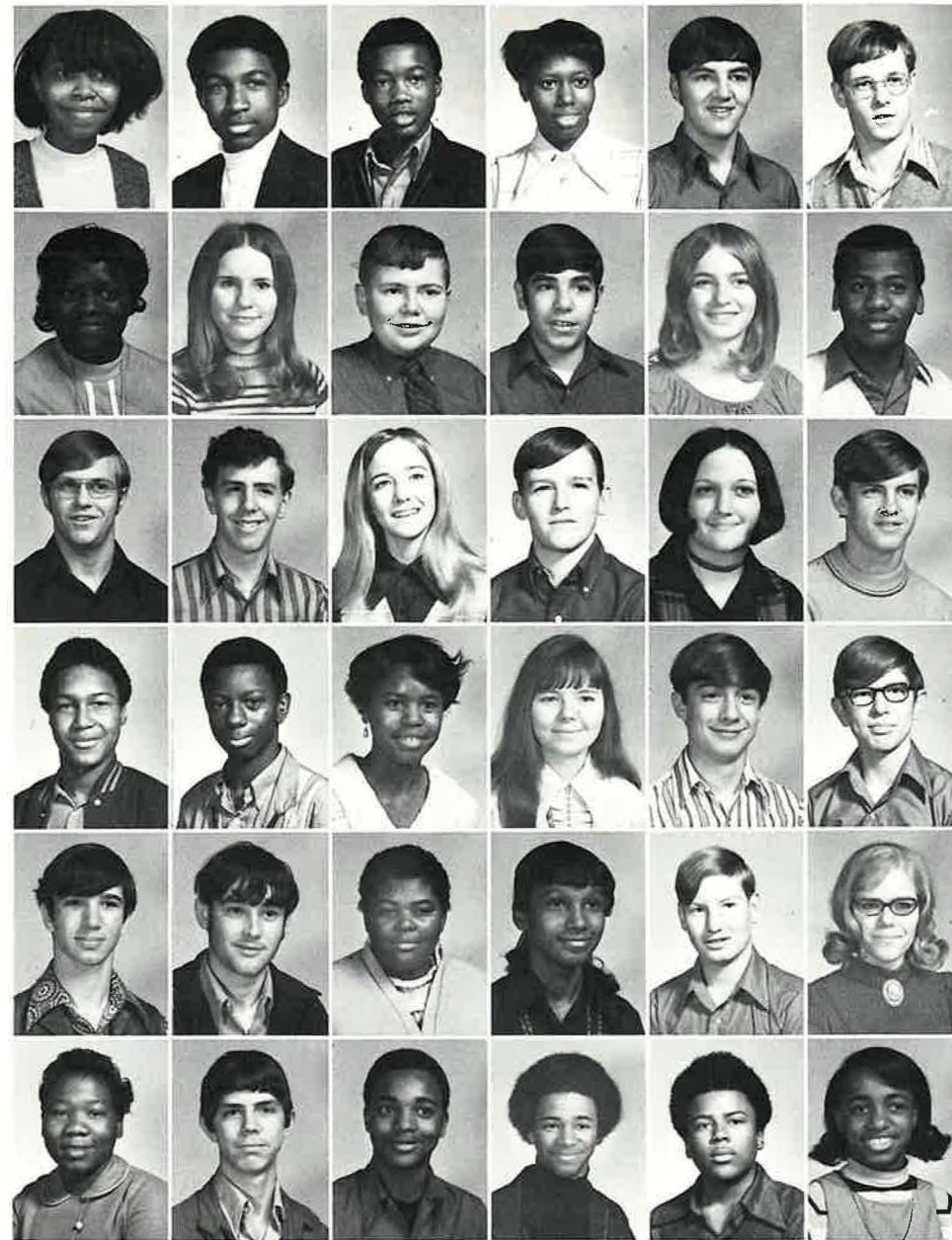
