





























Confusion

Stalks Covington High School






Important in adding to the already large disturbance were several bomb threats, which disrupted class schedules much to the delight of the student body.


Cathcart Makes Changes


Science Teachers Experiment











Student Council











Taylor Publishing Company sponsored a yearbook seminar at Lambuth College in March. The seminar answered many questions and helped to give the yearbook more spirit.






Students Gain Teaching Experience


Future Homemakers — A Finger in Every Pie

Future Farmers on the Move
















Student Assistants






AIASA Promotes Building Power



Local civic groups financed the boys' trip to Cookeville, Tennessee, as well as the girls' trip to Murfreesboro.


Betty Crocker Award



Brenda Smith Receives Top Honor


Brenda Smith, Covington High's first valedictorian, managed to participate in many activities and still maintain her high academic average.


One of the most important areas to which Brenda devoted herself was the Student Council. She was elected secretary her junior year, and was elected to represent her class again in 1971.




Show Leadership in '70

The leading scorer for the season was Senior tailback Tim Posey who totaled 38 points this year. The leading rusher was Jim Baddour who rambled for 680 yards.











