Toward the end of the school year six students were chosen delegates to Boys' and Girls' State.


The qualifications for a representative are that he or she be in the top third of the Junior Class and show honor, courage, good character, and leadership.




New Courses for the Business Type











With the arrival of first year coach Bill Bradley, Covington saw new life jump into the spirit of Covington High School basketball. All the basketball girls remembered his first bits of coaching: "Ladies, we're going to the state this year. I know we're going to be a good team, but I'm not satisfied with being just good, I want us to be great." Champions the Lady Chargers were, both in the District and in the Region. This marked the second consecutive year the Lady Chargers has won the District but it had been twelve long years since a team representing Covington in the Region could shout, "We're number one." Covington lost to tough Jackson Central Merry in Sub-State play, the first round play of the state tournament.









They marched at every football game, attended the usual contests, and had daily rehearsals.


The band presented three concerts, sent a delegate to the All-West Tennessee

Needless to say, the situation could have been different if the band members had not been cooperative and felt a certain pride in their organization.








Future Farmers, Competent and Aggressive










Latin Club Relives Roman Holidays























SPONSORS' COMMENTS
